There, under a snowdrift, they found 10 bars of gold worth \$300,000.
Since 1950, police have recovered \$700,000 worth of the yellow metal stolen in 11 such robberies or holdups.
But another \$700,000 has disappeared.
In the most recent robbery, 12 boxes of bullion, valued at \$383,000, were taken at Winnipeg's International Airport by two men posing as Air Canada workers. They signed for the gold and drove it away in a stolen truck.
The mint from Red Lake, Ont. Beside the 10 boxes found in the snowdrift, another one was recovered in a downtown Winnipeg building. One box still is missing.
In August, 1950, police near Timmins, Ont., poked into the ashes of a burned-out car and found \$100,000 in gold bricks. The thieves panicked when faulty brake drums on the stolen car caught fire.
The Yellowknife plane theft was pulled by Tony Gregson, a Briton. He substituted boxes of lead for the gold while in flight and walked off the aircraft with the gold. He told later how he blew the last of it in a crap game in Nassau and came back to Canada to serve a jail term.

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British Columbia Has First In Lilliputian Pulp Mill

VANCOUVER (CP) — British Columbia has scored another first in the pulp and paper industry—a pulp mill two feet high that uses logs six inches long.
The concentration of Lilliputian industry is located in a sprawling downtown Vancouver workshop owned by H. A. Simons Ltd., consulting engineers and specialists in pulp mill construction.
