Current News Items.

It is estimated that if the present rate of increase is maintained, the United States will fifty years hence have a population of 190,000,000.

The English ship-yards are full of orders and are now turning out an amount of tonnage. The demand is said to be chiefly on speculative account and as a result the supply is in excess of the demand and the shipping business is overcrowded.

The prospectus of the Halifax Steam Navigation Company (limited) has been issued. The company has been formed for the purpose of establishing direct steam communication with Great Britain to and from Halifax, via St. John. The capital is placed at \$200,000.

The little kingdom of Denmark is going in for prohibition with a high hand. A scheme has been brought forward for the compulsory closing of all breweries, ale houses, and brandy shops, as well as for prohibiting the importation and sale of all forms of intoxicating liquors.

In pursuance of an order of Mr. Justice Peters, dated the sixth day of June, 1883, in the matter of An Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign, Chapter 23, intitled "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company."
