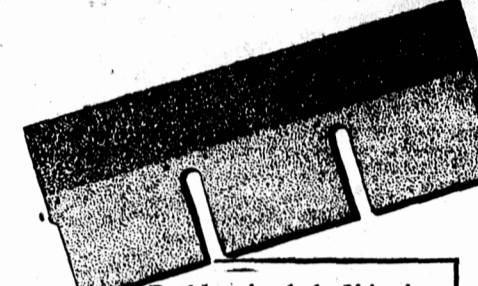
A discussion took place concerning ways and means of raising funds. The large scale concert is to be held this year in October with Mrs. Cook as convenor of the program committee.
