

Gov't Has 2 Choices, Says Prince MP

SUMMERSIDE — Dr. O. H. Phillips, MP for Prince, said yesterday there are two avenues open to the federal government in relieving the Island's transportation problem. The Prince MP arrived in Summerside to spend the Easter recess. Mrs. Phillips and their children are remaining in Ottawa. Dr. Phillips said that if the proposed causeway is a long way off, a new ferry will likely be built. While, on the other hand, should construction of the causeway in the near future seem feasible, the government might buy one of the ships which are available in Michigan to be operated in the interim.

In reply to a question in Parliament Hon. George Hees, minister of transport, told Dr. Phillips the "interim situation is receiving our urgent consideration." As to the suggestion of the Island members that consideration be given to the purchase of the icebreaking ferry, Vacationland or one of the other ferries formerly in use on the straits of Mackinac run, Mr. Hees said, "This suggestion is being looked into."



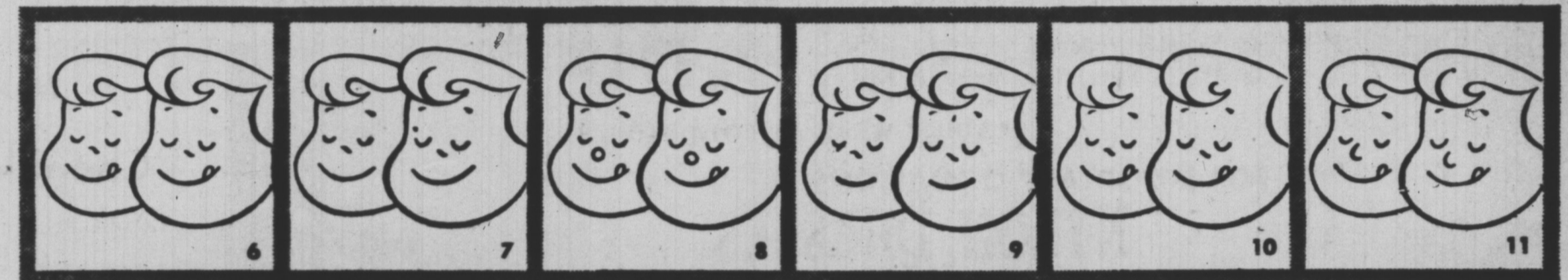
