A. OSCAR CURRIE
 (inserted by friends and relatives as a tribute to the deceased.)
 The death of A. Oscar Currie occurred at his home in North River, on June 8, 1963.
 The late Mr. Currie was born at Green Bay on December 30, 1885.
 As a young man he migrated to U.S.A. He spent several years there. Later he moved to British Columbia. In 1940 he returned to P.E.I. and settled at East Wiltshire where he made his home.
 For the past two years the deceased was a semi-invalid. He was hospitalized for two or three weeks on different occasions, but he preferred to be in his home where he was tenderly cared for by his wife.
 Surviving Mr. Currie are his wife, (nee Ruby Christina Rose) and one brother, Daniel Currie, Charlottetown. Seven step-children also mourn the loss of a kindly man who was interested in their welfare at all times.
 In the community Mr. Currie was esteemed as an honest up-right neighbour.
 Rev. T.W. Howard, North River Baptist Church, assisted by Rev. Isaac Walls, Cornwall United Church, conducted the large funeral service, and faithfully administered the hearers to prepare to meet their God.
 Mrs. Sterling MacLeod, Cornwall, sang "The Old Rugged Cross" and in a pleasing manner brought to the large audience the message: "Was on that old cross Jesus suffered and died, to pardon and sanctify me."
 "Rock of Ages" and "Abide With Me" were the chosen hymns. The pianist was Mrs. Laurence Molyneux, North River.
 Burial was in East Wiltshire cemetery where the remains were tenderly laid to rest by the following friends: Messrs. Frederick J. Jones, Jewell, George Yeo, Roy Bruce, John MacPhail and Andrew Gass.
