

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

ROME, Dec. 11.—At a private consistory, to-morrow, the Pope will announce the creation of Monsignor Hasson as Cardinal, the appointment of Rev. Uolla Larrias as Bishop of Nicaragua, and transfer of Bishop Hegan from St. Joseph, Mo., to Kansas City, Mo.; Bishop Faham from Nashville, Ten., to Chicago, Ill., and Archbishop Corrigan from Newark, N. J., to New York; the creation of several Cardinals in *betto* and the appointments of several French and Spanish Bishops in *partibus infidelium*.

CAPE TOWN, Dec. 11.—A foraging party in Leribe district has been compelled to retire with the loss of thirteen colonials. Affairs in the Transvaal are very serious. The Boers are assembled in large numbers and threaten to resort to force. An attempt will be made to arrest the ringleaders and a proclamation has been issued warning the Boers of the result of persistence in agitation.

NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—Hymen Valenburgh, a Hebrew tailor, aged 50, was found dead to-day in a room on Baxter street, where he had lived two years alone. The body was frozen stiff.

Francis Smith, a young man, was found on the streets last night suffering from cold and died on a stoop, in Second avenue this morning, having perished from cold while intoxicated.

Eugene Connolly, aged 50, was found dead on the rear stoop of his home, Water street, this morning, having perished from cold while intoxicated.

WORCESTER, Mass., Dec. 12.—Fred L. Almy, bookkeeper for E. Smith & Co., wholesale grocers, is a defaulter in \$8,000 or \$10,000 by falsifying books. The amount was taken in the last ten months. He spent it in fast living.

LAWRENCE, Mass., Dec. 12.—A horrible tragedy occurred here to-night, a woman being shot and instantly killed by her paramour, who is a married man, with a family. He also, afterwards, attempted to take his own life. The victim, Avis Pinkham, was employed as a table-girl, in a boarding house, No. 9 Pacific Corporation. The assassin is Knapton Wardman, until recently overseer of the Washington mills. Wardman and Miss Pinkham, after returning from a walk this evening, stood conversing on the corner of Franklin and Lincoln streets, when Wardman suddenly drew a revolver, pushing Miss Pinkham against a high board fence, shooting her in the head behind the right ear. She fell dead. Wardman then went home, kissed his children and shot himself. He is not expected to live until morning. Jealousy is the supposed cause.

A Garibaldian, who recently arrived at Athens, has proposed to the government, on behalf of Menotti Garibaldi, the formation of a Garibaldian corps of 7,000 men in the event of war between Greece and Turkey.

The Greek Chamber of Deputies have passed a convention between the government and the National Bank for a loan of 62,000,000 drachmas. This is significant.
