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## Million-Dollar Bids Made For Gas Sites In Alberta

EDMONTON (CP)—Eight bids of more than \$1,000,000 apiece, accepted for oil and natural gas leases near a wildcat well in northwestern Alberta at a provincial government sale that focused attention on the North Zama region, 432 miles northwest of Edmonton.

All the bids came from the Montreal Trust Co. and were for tracts within a five-mile radius of a well drilled last summer by Hamilton Brothers Canadian Gas.

The well is 48 miles northeast of the Rainbow Lake oil discovery that sparked vigorous development in the area during the last 20 months.

The Hamilton well still is reported undergoing tests and no results have been announced.

It was drilled on a 320-acre crown lease for which the company paid \$4,266 an acre in July. It was a record acreage price for a lease on wildcat territory—outside proven fields.

Under Alberta regulations, the company is not required to release results of the well for one year.

Oil sources in Edmonton say the wildcat is rumored to be a producer and that Montreal Trust was believed acting for a consortium of oil companies in its bids.

Four other wells are being drilled in the North Zama region.

Top price paid by Montreal Trust was \$2,592,015, or \$5,400 an acre, for 460 acres adjoining the Hamilton lease.

In the same township, Montreal Trust paid \$2,400,015 or \$7,500 an acre, for 320 acres.

The sale included tracts in scattered parts of Alberta as well and netted the government \$26,444,110, biggest one-day take in two years.

## Actor Admits He's Bankrupt

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Actor George Sanders, saying he was the "victim of an international swindle," filed a bankruptcy petition listing liabilities of nearly \$1,000,000.

In a prepared statement he said that as a shareholder in an investment company building food-processing factories in Scotland he signed bank guarantees for \$1,500,000.

"Other investors included many prominent members of international society," he said. "Our losses came to well over \$3,000,000."

"Criminal charges have been brought against two former officers of the now-defunct company."

Sanders, 60, listed assets of \$57,857 and said he paid \$300,000 into the investment company, which became defunct after funds were misappropriated.
