Pay Tribute To Christian Dior

PARIS (Reuters)—Two thousand fashion leaders Tuesday paid their final tributes to Christian Dior, the man whose designs defined the apparel tastes of women throughout the world.

A black cloth ornamented with the silver initials CD awaited the front of the church here where a requiem mass was sung.

The church was decorated with Dior's favorite flowers—lily of the valley, red roses and orchids.

A silent crowd of 7,000 packed the area outside the church of St. Honoré d'Étoile and the windows of nearby buildings were jammed by persons trying to glimpse the funeral procession for the 35-year-old designer, who died last week while on a brief vacation in Italy.

Dior will be buried Thursday in the family vault at the little French Riviera village of Gaillefontaine, Cannes.
