**THE EXPERT'S "EDGE"**  
The expert's advantage over lesser players is nowhere more noticeable than in the play of such deals as the following:

**East dealer. Both sides vulnerable.**

**The bidding:**

East	South	West	North
Pass	1♠	Pass	3♠
Pass	4♠	Pass	4♠
Pass	6♠	Pass	Pass

West opened the heart Queen. South won and drew two rounds of trumps, then cashed the king and ace of diamonds, ruffed a diamond, and ruffed his own remaining heart in dummy. He now led a club, and when East played the deuce, put in his own jack, quite willing to lose the finesse, but when West returned the club ten and East showed out, South found that he would have to concede another club trick.

South's technique was not good! Eliminating the hearts and diamonds from both hands was correct, but his following plays were inexcusable. After drawing trumps, the right play was to lay down one high club before going to dummy and leading a club toward the closed hand. Had this been done, South would have seen for himself, when East "falled" on the second club lead, that West had all the remaining clubs, and he would have passed the club trick to West, not wasting the jack, in the knowledge that any return would give him the balance.

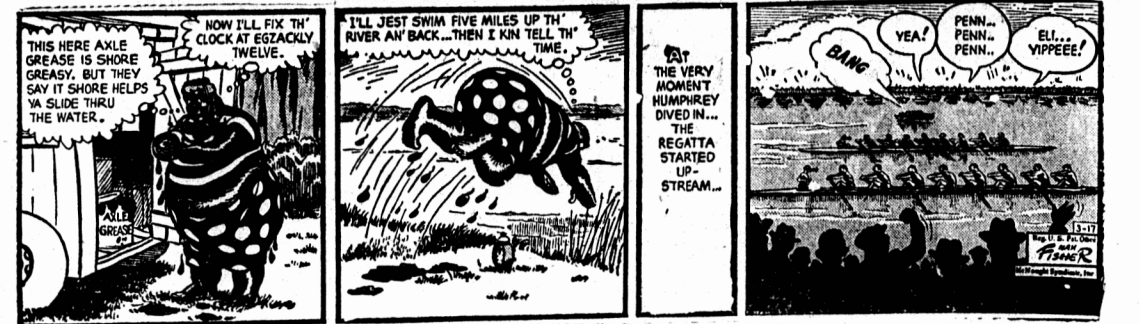
Even after failing to cash a high club, however, and with the stripping of the red suits completed, it would be an absolute safety play to lead a club from dummy and, when East played the deuce, to put in the six-spot from the closed hand! What could West possibly return that could earn a second defensive trick?

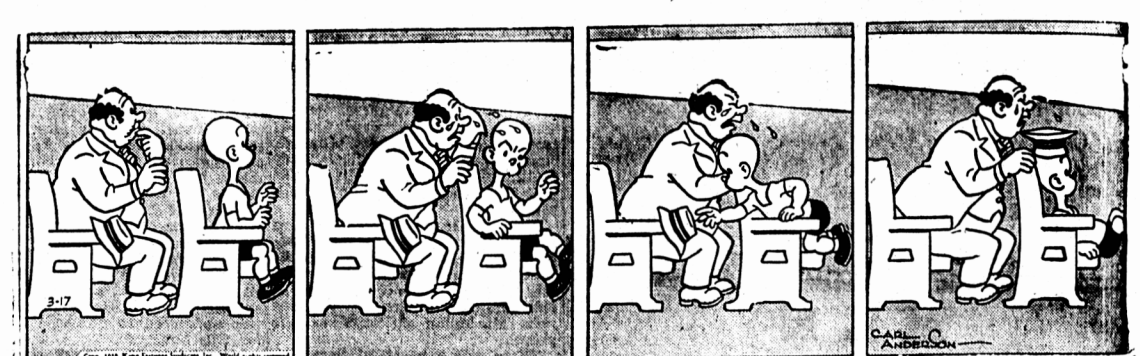

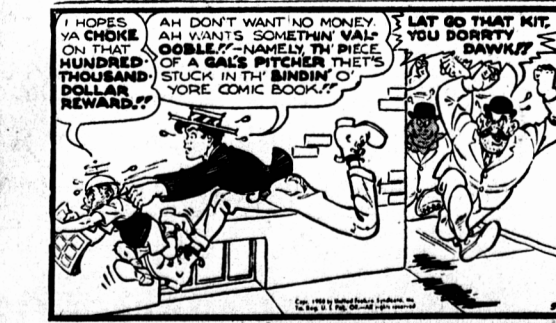
