FRENCH-CANADIAN LOYALTY.

(Montreal Gazette.)

The Toronto Globe has taken to eulogizing the loyalty of the French-Canadian allies with such effusiveness that even the French-Canadians feel obliged to protest against the Globe's extravagances. The Gazette, of Quebec, in the course of a long article on the subject, warns the Ontario Liberal press not to deceive itself by self-created illusions. "We are loyal," it says, "merely from interest—neither from love nor fear—because England is the only power able to protect us from the enterprise of American annexationists. * * * We are satisfied with the present regime, we do not wish to change it, and we are prepared to fight the invaders who would offer us another; but all this talk of gratitude, loyalty, pride of the French-Canadians to belong to the British Crown is as extravagant as the sighs of our poets and orators for a return to French rule." People who live in the province of Quebec understand the situation and do not expect from the French-Canadians the sentiments which naturally accompany British blood and British traditions. The Globe will make no permanent political capital out of ascribing to the French-Canadians sentiments they themselves disown. The loyalty of the French-Canadians is a very real and valuable quality, both from the Canadian and the imperial point of view; but it is not the sentiment of loyalty as people of British blood understand it, and nothing is to be gained by trying to make out that it is. Our French fellow citizens are good Canadians, and loyal and contented subjects of the Queen. It is not necessary to say this, and it goes better without saying, because in this province, where the French-Canadians are known, it is taken for granted. The best service the Ontario journalists, both Liberal and Tory, can do to the French-Canadians and the Empire, is to leave them alone. They have an excellent character, but like many highly respectable ladies, they will not be advanced in public esteem by having their reputation made a subject for discussion.
