University Honours Island Barrister

Congratulations are being extended to Carl H. Morawetz, LL. B., LL. M., of the Prince Edward Island Bar, who today is having the degree of "Doctor of Jurisprudence" conferred upon him by the Senate of the University of Toronto.

Mr. Morawetz has had a brilliant career as a student. He attended for three years at the Law Faculty of the University of Vienna, in Austria, where he successfully passed: (1) the State Examination on the History of Jurisprudence; (2) the Judicial State Examination; and (3) the Special Examination known as "Judicial Rigorosum".

He afterwards attended the University of Toronto, where he received the Degree of Bachelor of Laws and later the Degree of Master of Laws.

Mr. Morawetz has been engaged for some years on the editorial staff of various legal publications in Toronto. His treatise on Taxation of Compensatory Payments in the field of Income Tax Law, which was written as a preparatory thesis to his Doctor's degree, has obtained unconditional approval by the University authorities, and will shortly be published. Mr. Morawetz was admitted to the Bar of Prince Edward Island in June, 1948, after having been an articled student-at-law in the office of W. E. Bentley, K. C., for four years.

It is understood Mr. Morawetz will continue to reside in Toronto.

Committed For Trial On Murder Charges

PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, June 8—(CP)—Five men were committed for trial today on charges of murder in the death of a fisherman whose body was found bound hand-and-foot and heavily weighted.

Boysie Singh, John Durant, Eldon Coggins, Augustus James and David Bruce were charged with the murder of Philbert Fyson, one of several fishermen, who have disappeared at sea during the last two months. Local fishermen have been wary to put to sea, fearing that a band of pirates is operating off the coast, killing fishermen and looting their boats.

HOW TO GET BIGGER "PORK PROFITS"

Repeated tests have proved that most hog raisers can increase their pork profits by following the 6 proven methods of swine management outlined below. They are not hard to follow, yet they pay big dividends.

1. GET BIG LITTERS. Big healthy litters are obtained by selecting prolific gilts and sows and breeding to a first class, well cared-for boar. By keeping a record of farrowings and choosing breeding gilts by means of such records, you will increase the average size of your litters.
2. HAVE HEALTHY, MUSKY PIGS. The growth and development of the unborn litter call for proteins of good quality and for minerals and vitamins in proper proportion. Feed Miracle Brood Sow Ration to your sows from breeding time to farrowing and you'll seldom have trouble with sickly pigs.
