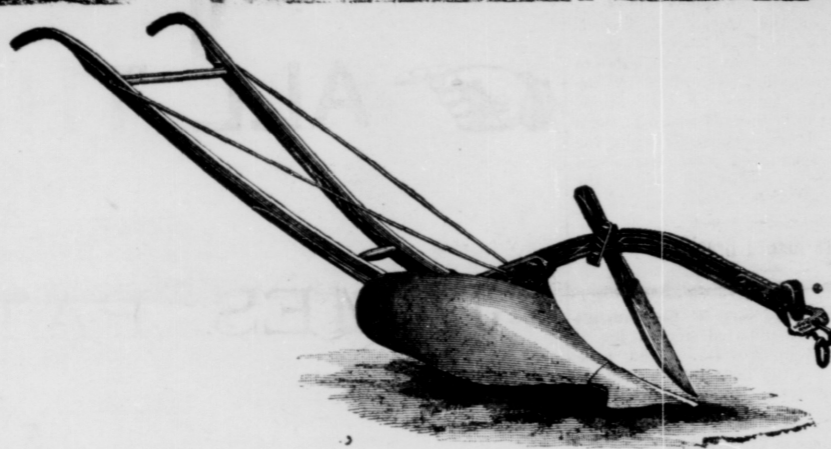

In fact, he took new ground, which had never been thought of at all not at all events gone into so exhaustively and with such telling effect. This is a large amount of money, and of course Prince Edward Island has to bear her share of the burden. Being one-fourth part of the Dominion she would have to bear her share the large sum of \$63,420,851.10

Calculated the same way the loss to the Dominion on the amount spent in this Province since Confederation, including loss on the cost, interest on cost, and working expenses of the Dominion railways, after deducting receipts, was—

My object in making this calculation was to show that there is no ground whatever for the statement that is so often made that the Dominion has not advanced her share of the Dominion's public works for her benefit, and to consideration from the Dominion of Canada, on the ground that there is a small deficit in the working of the Prince Edward Island Railway. That road, from the fact that the original cost was not charged to the Dominion of Canada, is not a very large loss, relatively to the population of the Island and the other public works throughout the Dominion.

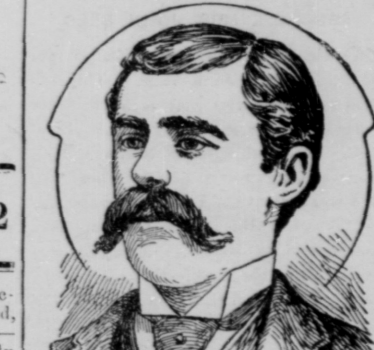
