Uranium was slightly higher but Bathurst-area base metals slipped a little with Gunnar's 40-cent gain the group's biggest change. New Larder U was down six cents to a new low of \$1.41 in moderate trading.

Grandines was up four cents on 141,000 shares. Inspiration, a northern Ontario base metal holding company, was up 53 cents with a volume of 50,000 shares.

Gold was slightly lower with all categories showing a majority of small losses. Dome, a senior, added 37 1/2 cents.

Base metals gained with Hudson Bay up \$1.25.

Western oils slipped a little in scattered trading. Royalite and Amalgam were slightly stronger.

Closing indexes showed golds down 29 at 70.79, base metals up 92 at 139.44, and western oils down 1.13 at 92.54.

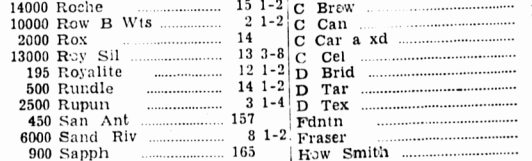

London Art Gallery

Accused Of Wasting Public Money

LONDON (Reuters)—A former president of the Royal Academy Sunday night demanded an inquiry into the affairs of the Tate Gallery which has been accused of wasting public money in buying art masterpieces.

"An investigation of the running of the Tate Gallery is long overdue," Sir Alfred Munnings said, "and I am far from being alone in that opinion."

The row came to a head during the week-end when artist Graham Sutherland resigned from the Tate board of trustees after complaining that the London gallery had made "considerable wastage of public money on modern art."

Sutherland, who now is in southern France alleged in a letter that the Tate directors too often passed up buying modern works by established painters at "a reasonable price."

Wrong Funds Used Last week the trustees admitted that by mistake they had bought 14 works worth about \$6,000 from the wrong funds.

Sutherland's letter charged that between 1939 and 1951 money was spent from three trust funds for objects that outside the scope of the trusts concerned.

Sunday night two former Tate trustees said they agreed with the charges made by the 50-year-old artist.

"I suspected that things were not economically run," said Henry Lamb.

"I am sure that a public inquiry would be good," said Charles Wheeler. "A great many artists have a feeling that there has been unwise spending at the Tate."

However, John Piper, who was a Tate trustee until last March, said, "We had some ups and downs, but on the whole I think it was not badly administered at all."
