Rev. Sam Martin Missionary Dies

One of the best known and most beloved missionaries of the north country, Rev. Samuel Angus Martin, formerly of Churchill, Man., died in his 67th year at his home in Portland, Oregon, Tuesday morning. He was known to have been in poor health for several years.

Mr. Martin, who earned for himself the name of "the man who put the church in Churchill," was born at Orwell, Prince Edward Island, in 1873. He was the youngest of a family of 15 children, born to Samuel Martin and Sarah Campbell Martin, who emigrated from Scotland to Orwell in 1820.

Mr. Martin came to Manitoba 31 years ago as field secretary of the Christian Endeavor union and was transferred from the Presbyterian church in the United States to the Presbyterian church in Canada. In 1927, when he was minister of the United church at Hamilton, he received the appointment of missionary-at-large on the Hudson Bay railway, and from then until his health failed in 1934, he ministered to the bands of construction men along the line.

He will be remembered by a host of men from all parts of Canada, who followed the construction of the railway to the sea. On that stormy day in March, 1929, when

"steel" reached the tide-water at Churchill, Rev. Sam Martin was at hand to wrap some tinfol around the "last spike" of the Hudson Bay railway and drive it home.

During his period of service in the north, Mr. Martin built two churches along the railway, the first at Gilliam in 1927, and the other at Churchill in 1929. It was while he was building the latter that a young banker at Churchill, then a young banker at Churchill, passing him one day busy working on the church, pointed him out to a friend, saying: "There is the man who is putting the church in Churchill." The catchy phrase stuck to Mr. Martin for years and helped to make him a popular and familiar figure on the lecture platform.

As a boy, Mr. Martin attended Moody Institute in Chicago, Illinois. Here he met Nettie Fielding, who later became his wife. Of Mr. Martin's brothers and sisters, 13 reached maturity, four were school teachers, and two were successful clergymen. These two brothers and Mr. Martin himself served as chaplains with the Canadian army overseas. Eight nephews also served overseas, three of whom were killed in action.

Following his resignation from the Rock Lake presbytery of the United church last June, Mr. Martin, with his family, moved to Portland, Oregon, where he resided until his death.

Immediate members of his family

who survive him are his wife; and two daughters, Margaret, a teacher at Melita high school; and Mrs. Ernest Yeo, of Portland. One son, Wallace James, died in 1930.

He is also survived by two brothers, John S. of Kinross, P. E. I., and Malcolm C. of Portland, Oregon, three sisters, Mrs. Catherine MacLean, Charlottetown, Mrs. Fred Beer, Boston, and Mrs. Sarah MacKenzie, Hunter River.

Mr. Martin visited this province about eight years ago at which time he delivered an address in Trinity Church on the mission work in Churchill.
