Stanfield Hopes For Fast Action

HALIFAX CP - Premier Stanfield said here Wednesday he hopes an investigation into the railway freight rate structure will begin rapidly "to bring relief to shippers in this area."

Mr. Stanfield was commenting on the 17 per cent freight rate boost allowed earlier Wednesday by the Federal Cabinet.

In announcing the cabinet's decision, acting Prime Minister Green said a study will begin at once "to work out measures to relieve against inequities in the freight rate structure, including any that may be aggravated by the present increases."

QUITS POLITICS
AVIGNON, France (AP) - Edouard Daladier, premier of the French government that backed down before Hitler at Munich, wrote an end to his political career Thursday. The elder statesman of the Radical Socialist party, whose career spanned half a century, offered his resignation as mayor of Avignon. He was defeated decisively as a candidate for parliament in last Sunday's elections. Now 78, Daladier first became premier in 1932.

the season is a trifle too late opening on November 10th, and feel that a happy medium opening date, November 5th, would be more satisfactory. The season formerly opened on November 1st.

The reason that a later opening date was questioned was because trappers felt that the 1st, was a little too early, as many rats were not properly furred out on the belly... it had a bluish tinge and was light and short. They have found out that it didn't require ten days to give the belly fur the thickness and rich, brownish colour that adds price to the pelt. They have discovered that their fur is prime all over by the fifth of the month. They are something akin to crate fatted chickens... three or four extra days puts them in a top grade. Trapper readers of this column who feel that it is in your best interests to have the trapping season open on November 5th, instead of 10th, write to Mr. P. A. Murtagh, Deputy Minister, Department of Industry and Natural Resources, or to Ralph Jenkins, Provincial Game Association President, Charlottetown.

Last night (Wednesday) I listened in to Outdoor Forum and heard Mr. Sid Green build up a case for a continuance of the Pheasant Re-stocking Program on the grounds that band returns warranted same. How reliable is the return of bands proof that a re-stocking program is paying off? In 1956 approximately 2,800 banded pen reared pheasants were released in Kings, Queens and

Prince counties. I believe that 28,000 of these bands had been removed from the leg of pheasants that had died and then turned in after the hunting season opened purporting to be from birds shot in the open season.

MADE INQUIRY
I took the trouble to investigate a report that 7 bands were taken from dead pheasants from the release in 1956 and turned in that fall. I was told the bands came from birds released in the T. Hill area. As a matter of fact I had heard shortly after this release that 7 of the birds were picked up in a field near T. Hill that had died in a company group apparently from starvation as there was nothing in their crops. Recently I talked to a chap regarding the report that bands from those pheasants were turned in that fall. He admitted that the report was true but he was not actively connected with the little scheme to boost the re-stocking program although was in a sense "in on it." I am not inferring that the sponsors of the program had any knowledge of this either before or after it occurred but I do feel it was the work of an over zealous hunter who was
