150 New Cars Slide Into Ohio River

GOLCONDA, Ill., Dec. 18—(AP)—About 300,000 worth of new automobiles slid off the icy decks of a river barge at Golconda today and sank in 36 feet of water in the Ohio River. The accident occurred during a high windstorm. Attendants set buoys to mark the spot where the 150 automobiles sank.

Toronto Citizens Facing Transportation Tie-up

TORONTO, Dec. 18—(CP)—Toronto's street-car and bus operators, seeking a wage increase, decide tomorrow whether to strike to back up their demands. An affirmative vote would paralyze public transportation in Canada's second largest city at the height of the Christmas shopping season.

LONDON, Dec. 19—(Wednesday)—(Reuters)—Two Russians have been executed in Russia by a firing squad for espionage after being dropped from an American plane, Moscow radio said today.

News In Brief

MONTREAL, Dec. 18—(CP)—Montrealers, digging themselves from under a week-end 10-inch snowfall, were today hit by another blizzard. Six-inch snowfall was expected.
THE HAGUE, Netherlands, Dec. 18—(Reuters)—The British steamer Chiswick reported she was "down by the head" in mid-Atlantic tonight and requested help. A message received here said the ship was making four knots, down by the head and shipping water with her decks awash.
BRIDGEWATER, N. S., Dec. 18—(CP)—The condition of 26-year-old Beverly Smith, cut across the face yesterday with an axe allegedly wielded by a woman during an argument, remained serious in hospital here tonight. Police, meanwhile, carried out an investigation. No arrest was reported.

U. S. Icebreakers Returned By Reds

BREMENHAVEN, Germany, Dec. 18—(Reuters)—Two United States icebreakers, the North Wind and the West Wind, lent to the Soviet Union under wartime lend-lease, arrived today to be handed back. They were due here earlier this month but were delayed at sea. The United States has been trying to get the ships returned since 1946.

10-Inch Snowfall Ties Up Traffic In Ontario

TORONTO, Dec. 18—(CP)—Southern Ontario tonight lay muffled under snow drifted feet deep in places. An all-day storm moving in from the west deposited up to 10 inches of heavy, wet snow from the Lakes Erie and Huron areas to the Quebec border. The fall, which began late last night, ended tonight and colder weather settled over the province.

Santa Claus Broadcast Causes Many Protests

SYDNEY, Australia, Dec. 18—(Reuters)—A Sydney kindergarten teacher tonight defended herself against nation-wide protests that she spoiled Christmas for Australia's tots by broadcasting that there is no Santa Claus. The program was a feature entitled "Kindergarten Of The Air" to which thousands of children listen daily.

OTTAWA, Dec. 18—(CP)—An angry, name-calling debate swirled today around the Federal Government's anti-price fixing legislation. It threatened to carry this lingering session of parliament into Christmas week-end and perhaps beyond. As party lines were drawn around the controversial bill, George Drew warned with a possible hint of filibuster that his Progressive Conservative forces are prepared to carry on their campaign against it "for a long time."

How Forces Line Up

HALIFAX, Dec. 18—(CP)—Official forecasts issued tonight by the Dominion Public Weather Office here and valid until midnight Wednesday:

Snow, rain, and some freezing rain has spread over the Maritimes in advance of an intensifying storm now centered near Bangor, Me.
