UPEI's sex survey shocking? It's not meant to be — editor

A sex survey published in UPEI's student newspaper asking how often students masturbate or if they have ever faked an orgasm is not meant to shock readers, said the newspaper's editor.

Sean McQuaid, editor of the UPEI X-Press, said the sexual questionnaire, which appears in this week's issue, will give students a picture of the sexual climate on campus.

"We weren't looking for trouble, and we haven't gotten any either," said McQuaid.

The survey also asks students if they are sexually active, whether they are heterosexual, gay, lesbian or bisexual, how often they have sex, how many partners they have had, if they use contraceptives, if they have ever had oral or anal sex and what part of the body turns them on the most. The results of the survey will be published Oct. 21 in the newspaper's first-ever sex supplement.

McQuaid said UPEI's sex survey is "phenomenally tame" compared to ones published at other Canadian universities. One university has a sex supplement entitled the "Filthy Passion Supplement", said McQuaid.

"We've already had comments calling our survey Mickey Mouse," said McQuaid.

Kirby Ferguson, production editor and one of the authors of the

survey, said the survey isn't meant to be sensational. Rather, the entire sex supplement is meant to inform students, said Ferguson.

Besides the results of the survey, the sex supplement will include articles on things like condom use, safe sex, sexually transmitted diseases and less serious topics like an advice column on sex.

An article on random sexual facts (such as 1 out of 3 American males have had contact with a prostitute) will also be included in the supplement.

Ferguson said the sex supplement is meant to inform students as well as entertain. Many students are uninformed or misinformed about sex, said Ferguson, and the supplement may help improve communication between the sexes.

McQuaid isn't expecting any backlash from the survey or the sex articles as long as the newspaper doesn't do "anything stupid" such as publishing obscene photos or using needlessly vulgar language.

A disclaimer warning readers that the survey may be offensive to some was published at the beginning of the questions. The survey also asks readers to write to the paper if they are offended.

The newspaper has had no complaints so far and a "handful" of responses to the survey. McQuaid said the some of the responses from females were "quite frank" and some females said the survey
