**A DICK-CUNYNGHAM MEMORIAL.**

The Aberdeen Journal has received an interesting memento of the late Col. Dick-Cunyngham, V. C. It is a memorandum drawn up by that gallant officer's direction, and bears date about four days before his tragic death. It runs: "The more ignorant amongst them were especially flabbergasted (can think of no better word) by the success of the British arms. They went out to war with the expectation of shooting down red-coated soldiers without any risk to themselves. The terrible accuracy of the British artillery fire, the appearance of the enemy in the inconspicuous khaki, and, above all, the storming of their positions by the despised British infantry, came as so many tremendous surprises to them. They spoke with bated breath of the Gordons. Their fury in the charge and contempt of death they described as simply diabolical.—With Lieut.-Col. W. H. Dick-Cunyngham's compliments.
