Naval Veteran Dies in Toronto
TORONTO (CP) — The ashes of Dr. Archibald McCallum, 84, retired surgeon, commodore of the RCN, will be taken to Halifax and scattered on the sea outside the harbor from the deck of a destroyer.
Dr. McCallum established the Canadian Navy's permanent medical service in 1944. He died here Tuesday.
The first man in the medical branch to reach commodore rank, Dr. McCallum retired 19 years ago.
He joined the Royal Navy in 1916 after graduating in medicine from the University of Toronto and interned at Gravenhurst's Muskoka Hospital. He joined the Canadian navy in 1921, served three years, then left for private practice in Toronto.
At the outbreak of the Second World War, he was called back to organize the naval medical services at Halifax.
He is survived by his wife, the former Dr. Arrabelle MacKenzie, a Toronto dentist, and a University of Ottawa lecturer in public health.

Old Nipissing Shares Replaced
TORONTO (CP) — Shares of Nipissing Mines Co. Ltd., one of the oldest listed mining companies on the Toronto Stock Exchange, will disappear from the trading list today.
At the same time shares of Patino Corporation Ltd., formed by the merger this week of Nipissing and Patino of Canada Ltd., will be called for trading.
Nipissing Mining Company was formed in 1954 as a silver-producing company in Northern Ontario's Cobalt area. It was listed on the exchange in 1958. Between the years 1956 and 1945 it paid shareholders a total of \$2,000,000 in dividends.
In 1952 it was amalgamated with its wholly-owned subsidiary, Nipissing Mining Co. Ltd., into one corporation.
Prior to the Nipissing-Patino merger, the company's major interest was in its wholly-owned subsidiary, Appalachian Sulphur Inc., a copper-producing mine in North Carolina.
It also had interests with Patino in other mining ventures.
Patino also held a major interest in Nipissing.

SC Candidate To Be Released From Air Force
NORTH BAY, Ont. (CP) — A spokesman for RCAF Station North Bay said Wednesday T.L. Lucien Richard, Social Credit candidate in the June 18 election for Terrebonne constituency near Montreal, will be released from the air force "as soon as documentation can be completed."
The decision of the RCAF followed an announcement Tuesday by chief electoral officer Nelson Castonguay that Mr. Richard's name would be allowed to stand.
Earlier Wednesday in Edmonton, Defence Minister Harkness said Richard is running for office "as a dodge to get out of the RCAF."
Mr. Harkness said he could not make further comment on Richard's candidacy until he has studied the situation more closely.

RC Commission Gives Report On Education
VATICAN CITY (AP) — A Vatican commission said Wednesday the Roman Catholic Church has the right to have its own schools and to "use all means to permeate state schools with Christian spirit."
The commission of studies and seminars, one of the church bodies preparing for the Roman Catholic ecumenical council reiterated the Catholic position on schools in documents to be distributed by the council.
Commission documents were outlined Wednesday by its chairman, Italian-born Giuseppe Cardinal Pizzardo, at a meeting of the central preparatory commission for the ecumenical council.
A statement in the press on Cardinal Pizzardo's report said teaching was one of the fundamental duties of the church. The statement added:
"One must not think, as some occasionally maintain, that this duty can be fulfilled only through preaching, or at the most, through a strictly religious instruction."
Cardinal Pizzardo's report marked the completion of his preparatory work for the ecumenical council.
The central commission hopes to complete its work June 30, the council-bringing together thousands of priests from around the world — will convene here Oct. 11.
