The Nova Scotia champions busted the game wide open in the second inning of Saturday's contest as they brought ten runs across the plate to take a commanding 10-1 lead.

Jim Fox is handling the Island representative and Fox said his squad just went up in the air in the second inning and couldn't execute routine plays. The locals committed five errors in the game and five of these were in the disastrous second frame.

Gerry Murphy went the route for the Fox coached forces and recorded five strikeouts.

Sloanwhite was teeing the slab for the winners and he sent 15 Charlottetown swingers down via the strikeout route in recording the win.

Big men at the plate for the Halifax outfit were Currie and Martin with two hits apiece.

The local club was limited to two base-knocks and these were garnered by Wilbur Birt and MacCallum.

With the exception of the second inning the teams played on relatively even terms and Jim Fox attributed the second inning collapse to some of the players being a little too nervous.

## Rustico Club Holds Tourney Acadia Axemen Maul Saints

Jack Blanchard, Birchwood High School, topped the field in the Island school teachers' 18-hole golf tournament staged at the Rustico Golf and Yacht Club Saturday.

This was the first of what is planned to be an annual affair for Island school teachers at the Rustico course. A good entry list teed off for Saturday's match and to teachers performed under ideal weather conditions.

John Kane, physical education instructor at Birchwood, finished in the runner-up slot in the tournament with Louis Dalton coming in with the third place honors.

Adelbert Roache finished fourth, Don Stewart was fifth with Ben Croken finishing up in sixth position.

The Axemen, led on by the huge crowd of home fans who turned out to see the game played in hot humid conditions, pressed in the fourth quarter and added three touchdowns. Quarterback Ron Anderson combined with Bruce Galloway with a 25 yard pass play to make it 13-6, and after that, it was all Acadia.

A duplicate of their double reverse with Cairns and Scwartz doing the running gave the Axemen their third major, followed shortly after by Bruce Galloway lateral to Paul Hannon from the 20 yard line for the fourth.

Anderson of Acadia was 4 for ten, passing; MacAleer was three for eight. St. Dunstan's had 15 net yards gained rushing, compared to the Axemen's 176.
