

New Toronto Juvenile And Family Court Has Many Sides

TORONTO (CP)—A new approach in handling juvenile delinquents began here when the Metropolitan Toronto juvenile and family court was moved from its crowded old basement quarters in city hall to a modernized \$1,300,000 building on east-central Jarvis Street.

Children received by the centre and judged to be delinquent undergo a week of observation during which they are examined by psychiatrists and their home life investigated. Then they go before one of the five juvenile court judges and are either released to their homes, directed to foster homes or as a last resort, sent to a training school.

While under observation the youngsters are segregated in different wings of the H-shaped three-storey building, according to their age, sex and offences.

WELL-EQUIPPED
They have access to classrooms, hobby shops, an indoor gymnasium and an outdoor playground fitted with underground steam pipes to remove snow during the winter.

"We are aiming at a constructive program here," said Senior Judge V. Lorne Stewart, a balance between the tough and the soft attitude in treating delinquents.

"We hope to be able to give the youngsters here the same treatment they would get from firm but intelligent parents at home."

Psychology is used in selecting in which of the five courtrooms the juvenile will appear, said Judge Stewart, father of four children.

"Smart Alec" youngsters end up in a court as auster and forbidding as any in Toronto. First offenders receive more intimate treatment in an informal hearing.

There are no bars in the observation wings but they have complete security. Big picture windows in the individual rooms are shatterproof and the aluminum-like screens on other windows are actually made of high-tensile steel which resists cutting or breaking.

Domestic relations, the other work of the centre, is also handled in a modern vein. Disputing or estranged couples waiting to tell their troubles to a judge sit on comfortable furniture in a tastefully decorated second-storey foyer.

Over the entrance to the courtrooms is an 88-foot mural by Jane Lipper of Kitchener, Ont., stressing the happiness of marriage and family life.
