**Mother Faces
Neglect Charge**
OTTAWA (CP)—Mrs. Marie
Turgeon, 25, has been charged
with failing to provide her chil-
dren with the necessities of life.
Two of her seven children are
in hospital. Authorities said the
youngest, two-month-old Alice,
weighs less than four pounds
and is suffering from malnutri-
tion. Ann, 18 months, was ad-
mitted to hospital with frost-
bite and impetigo.
Children's Aid officials said
she does not know the where-
abouts of her unemployed hus-
band who deserted the family
last month.
She said she pays \$6 a month
rent for her frame home. Every
widow in the home is broken
and the children sleep on a
couch in front of a stove. The
house was condemned and the
family was supposed to move
Monday but Mrs. Turgeon said
she was not able to find another
residence. Her children range
from eight years to two months.

Winnipeg (CP)—A Wint-
nipeg company, as one of its func-
tions, has become the produc-
tion centre of Canada's contribu-
tion to the space age.
At the Bristol Aero-Industries

Ltd. plants at Winnipeg's Inter-
national Airport and more re-
cently at an unmarked site
about 20 miles north of Wini-
peg are the home of the Black
Brant rocket and Canadian-pro-
duced solid rocket fuel.

In collaboration with the Na-
tional Research Council, the
company builds and fires the
rockets into the upper atmos-
phere, there to recover data and
information vital to future space
shots.
One of the reasons for the de-
velopment of the company in
Winnipeg is the geographical po-
sition.
Northern Manitoba has the
distinction of being the only
area of the world with an acces-
sible land mass under the heat

of the aurora borealis (northern
lights) and it is from the area
around Churchill, Man., that the
rockets are fired into this at-
mospheric phenomenon.
The solid fuel Rockwood pro-
pellant plant still is under con-
struction north of Winnipeg at
a cost of about \$2,000,000.
Built on 3,000 acres, with an
extensive buffer zone to protect
the public, the plant eventually
will comprise 12 widely-spaced
buildings. A 11 administration
will be handled from the Wini-
peg headquarters.

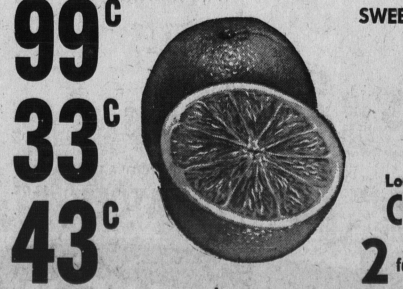
