

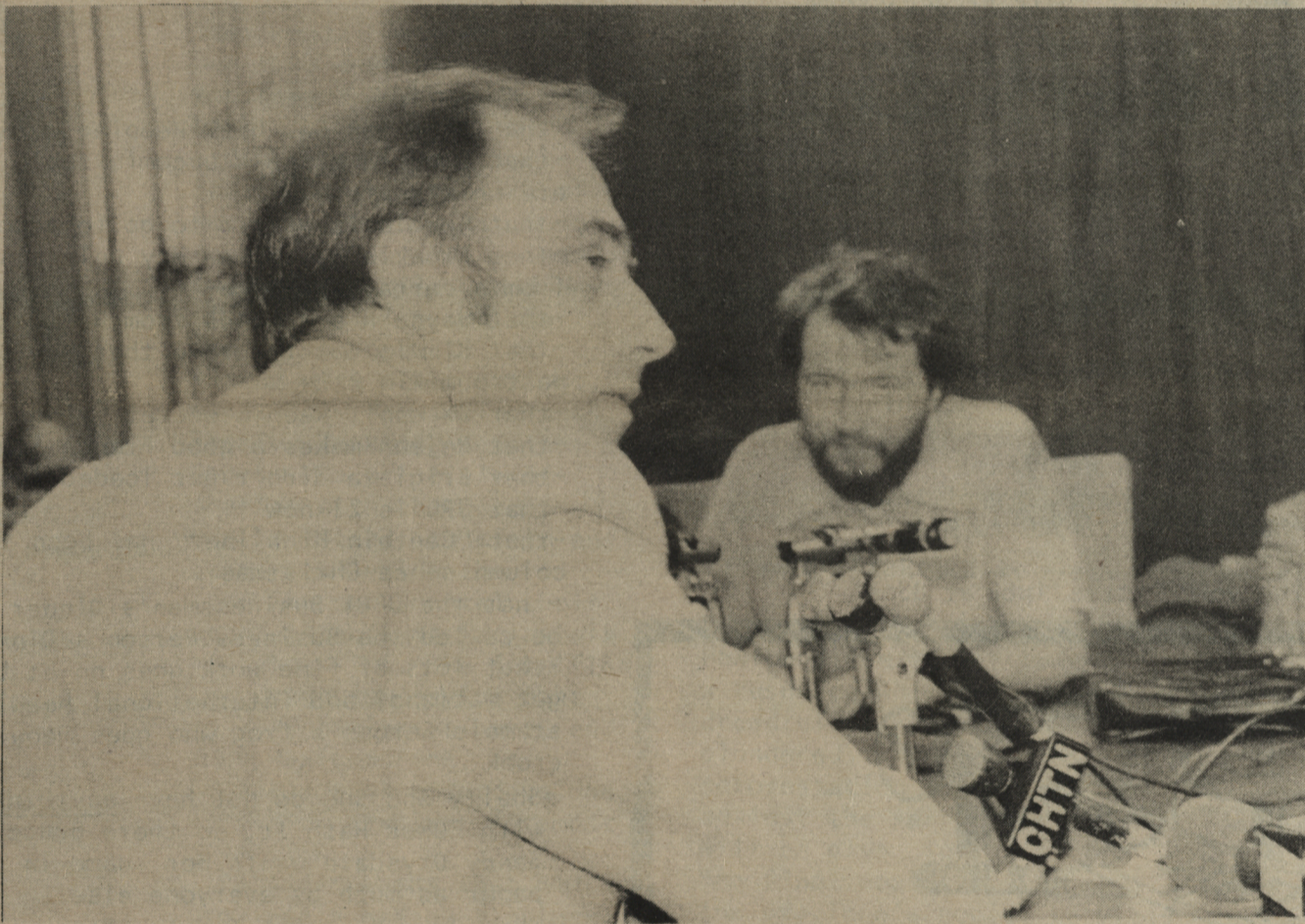
THANKS -- JOHN CAIRNS

BRIAN PECKFORD IS NO NEWFIE JOKE

The University of Prince Edward Island Business Society held its Annual Businessman's Dinner this past Monday at the Confederation Center. Guest speaker, Brian Peckford, Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador, provided the 380 in attendance with an entertaining and informative speech. Premier Peckford told

the audience that the money that Newfoundland will be gaining from oil revenues will only be temporary. He stressed the fact that Newfoundland needs the oil revenues to allow it to develop its fisheries, mining, and forests, resources that will be the foundation of Newfoundland's future. Premier Peckford also emphasized that the

development of the oil reserves must be done in an orderly fashion to insure no damage is done to the Newfoundland culture.

Premier Peckford also spoke to the Business students in the morning. He emphasized that Newfoundland's future is in its renewable resources, but these need capital to

develop and that capital can be gained through oil revenues.
