Opening lead—ace of hearts.
Because of the different systems in use, there were seldom hands where the bidding was identical in the U.S. Italy match.
As a result, there were strange repercussions in some deals.
One such hand was Deal No. 101, which cost the American team 800 points—7 IMPs. The bidding sequence shown in the diagram followed fairly natural lines.
Harmon led the ace and another heart. Belladonna made the fine play of leading the nine of clubs and ducking completely. Harmon took the ace and shifted to a diamond. Declarer rose with the ace and played a spade to the king.
He then led the K-Q of clubs.

TOKYO (AP) — Revolution in Tibet, peasant discontent over the communes, loss of prestige in Asia, economic difficulties — all these plague Red China as she prepares for the opening of her parliament, the National People's Congress.
The meeting of 1,200 delegates, starting Friday, will approve the country's budget and elect a successor for Mao Tse-tung as president.
All the important decisions were made when Mao presided over a central committee session April 2-5 in Shanghai, Peiping radio reported.
