P.E.I. Regiment To Play Host To Famed Canadian General

Major-General F.F. Worthington CB, MC, MM, CD, honorary colonel - commander of the Royal Canadian Armoured Corps, will arrive in Charlottetown this evening to visit the Prince Edward Island Regiment (P.E.I. Regt.). He is scheduled to leave the province tomorrow.

Known as "Fighting Frank", the father of the Royal Canadian Armoured Corps, General Worthington will attend a reception and dinner at the Charlottetown Hotel tonight at 7:30 as guest of the P.E.I. Regiment. All officers of the regiment, high ranking officers of 2 Militia Group, and former armoured corps officers in the province will also be on hand to meet this famous soldier.

Gen. Worthington, a native of Scotland, ran away to sea when a youth and came to Montreal from Chile to join the Black

Watch Regiment in 1914. He won the Military Medal in the First World War, and after being commissioned, the Military Cross.

He commanded the first armoured vehicle training center at Camp Borden, and commanded Canada's First Armored Brigade at the outset of the Second World War, and later the First Canadian Army Tank Brigade, the 4th Canadian Armoured Division, and Camp Borden, home of armoured corps training. He was named general officer commanding, Pacific Command in 1945, and retired from the Canadian Army in 1948.

He was later special advisor to the minister of national defence on civil defence planning, and after retiring from his CD post he embarked on a manufacturing enterprise which now takes up most of his time.

Beef Producers Said Losing \$40-\$60 Per Head On Island

"Beef producers on the Island are losing on the average from \$40 to \$60 per head on all the finished beef we are selling," Leo McIsaac, New Democrat candidate for Queens told farmers Thursday in New Glasgow Hall.

"We need a province-wide marketing organization controlled by producers themselves in order to get our just share of what the consumer is paying for our beef," Mr. McIsaac said. This organization would have to have at least holding and sorting pens properly located so that finished cattle could be tendered to packing houses for the highest bid, and the unfinished stock sold to best advantage as feeders.

"In this way, Mr. McIsaac explained, 'our farmers could negotiate in an organized way with the big packers for their product, and get their true market value. Unfinished cattle usually bring greater returns when sold as feeders than when marketed in the low grades as beef. 'Such an organization could also bring in feeder cattle for distribution to our farmers when there is a shortage here,' he said.

"Governments," Mr. McIsaac challenged, "have a responsibility in matters of this kind. The place of government is not to get involved directly in the marketing process but to actually help producers improve their own marketing program. This is more important than their production program. If our beef producers were not yet ready to use marketing legislation then government should be ready to encourage such a beef marketing program by paying a substantial premium for all the top grades of beef sold through this producer marketing set-up.

"Both old party governments," said Mr. McIsaac, "hesitate to help farmers with their marketing problems because the boys that pay their campaign bills must reap through their business bills."

"The importance of improving farm marketing conditions and assuring primary producers of a decent income is important to city workers and business, the speaker said. 'This is why everyone on the Island should support the New Democrats who have the only concrete farm program being offered. Even with a strong opposition group in Parliament, Mr. Douglas could do great things for Maritime farmers,' the New Democrat candidate continued.

Wilfred Inman charged the old parties with camouflaging the real issues of the election by importing speakers. He felt that consumers need protection from high interest rates and unfair

business methods. He explained that in addition to farm policies the New Democrats' program provided for a housing program and a code for consumer protection.
