An Interesting Budget of News.

The first business transacted by the House last week was the introduction of two new members, Conservatives, of course, viz., Hon. John Hearn, of Quebec West, in place of Thomas McGreevy, expelled, and William Fritman, in place of Mr. Frow, chief Liberal whip. Newstead. They were admitted and took their seats amid the usual manifestations of satisfaction from the Government benches.

Mr. McMillan, of Huron, in moving for a return showing the quantity of artificial fertilizers imported between July 1, 1891, and January 1, 1892, spoke strongly in favor of removing the duty from these articles. While at one time protection might have been necessary to the Canadian manufacturers, there was no occasion for it now.
