DEAR SIRS.—Your favor received. I only want at present two ends of 1 1/2 yards each for two mats, and four yards of fringe, some nice patterned carpets, with some red in it.

We sent the carpet on the 16th November, addressed as directed, but we did not send the fringe (as it was not in stock) or the invoice.

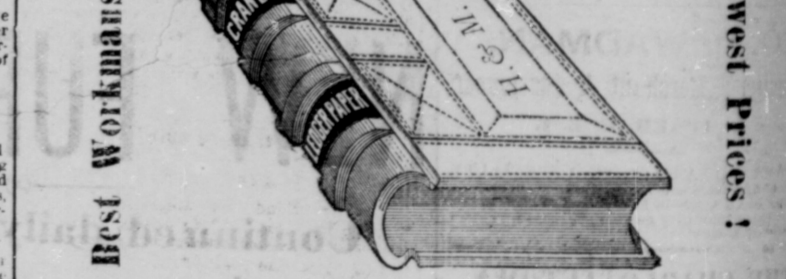
