## Former Ch'town Woman Dies At Sydney, N.S.

SYDNEY - Death struck a prominent Sydney family Thursday night for the second time in a week when Kathleen Connolly, eldest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Hohn Connolly of Sydney, and formerly of Charlottetown, died at the family residence, 62 George Street.

Miss Connolly, who had been ailing for some years, died a few hours after the funeral of a brother, Felix J. Connolly, a resident of Halifax for the last 25 years.

Mr. Connolly's funeral was held from the home of a brother, W. (Gene) Connolly, Whitney Ave., to Sacred Heart Church for Requiem Mass and burial was at Holy Cross cemetery.

Miss Connolly died early Thursday evening. She had been critically ill for days and brother Felix was stricken with a heart attack in a Halifax bank and died minutes after, as he prepared to leave for Sydney because of the illness of his sister.
