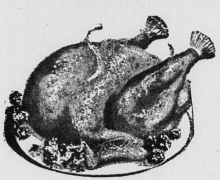

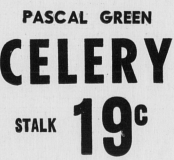

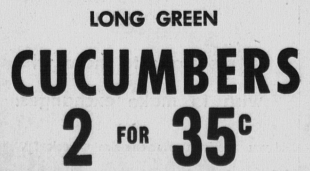

Liberal-NDP Merger Seen Unpractical

TORONTO (CP) — William Mahoney, national director of the United Steelworkers of America (U.S.A.), said Monday that the present structure of the Liberal party makes any suggestion of a merger with the New Democratic party unpractical.

"There is no possibility that the steelworkers could support the Liberal party as it now exists," said Murray Cotterill, union publicity director.

Mr. Mahoney made his statement after steelworkers called a special meeting Monday to discuss the union's stand on reports that top officials of both parties in Ottawa and Toronto were discussing possibilities of a merger.

TALKS INFORMAL
Ontario NDP Leader Donald C. MacDonald and former Ontario Liberal leader John Wintermeyer admitted at the weekend that there had been informal discussions, but no definite suggestions of a merger. In Ottawa, National NDP Leader T. C. Douglas denied knowledge of any talks between federal officials of both parties.

"Mr. Mahoney, who last June called on Canadian unions to support the NDP," said steelworkers' officials had had discussions on the possibility of a merger with Liberal officials, but these had been "neither secret nor official."

"We are fully in accord with Mr. Donald MacDonald's opinion that the structure of the Liberal party, as it now exists, makes any suggestion of a party merger quite unpractical."

Paul Robeson Returns To U.S.

NEW YORK (AP) — Ailing Paul Robeson has returned from his five-year exile. But his wife says he still thinks communism is "terrific and he always will."

The 65-year-old Negro hard-tone and actor, who in 1962 received the Stalin Peace Prize arrived in New York Sunday on a jet airliner from London. He and his wife, Estelinda, left East Germany last Wednesday.

Robeson's only airport comment was: "I'm happy to be back in the country and naturally I'm happy to be back in the civil rights movement. I have been a part of it all my life."

Mrs. Robeson said her husband planned merely to visit his family and try "to get well."

Smoker's Habits Study Needed, Journal Says

TORONTO (CP)—The motivations and habits of the Canadian smoker will have to be studied before any anti-smoking campaign can be successful, says the Canadian Medical Association Journal.

An editorial in the journal says the decision by the federal government to spend \$400,000 in an anti-smoking campaign should provide the occasion for a searching review of current methods employed in cancer education and the assumption underlying them.

"A great deal of complex research is required relative to communication, habit formation, and motivation to individual health-promotion activity before decisive program can be mounted," the editorial says.

"We urgently need to know what techniques are likely to be effective in eradicating those deep-rooted anxieties and prejudices that prevent many from seeing any important problem in cigarette smoking."

The editorial also states that the Canadian public will need to be carefully prepared over a long period before action-producing cancer education can begin.

It says that an early sign of success, a "d e c e d e o r s o hence," will be the recognition by the public that cigarette smoking is no longer the thing to do.

Ontario Amends Statistics Act

TORONTO (CP) — The Ontario government has amended the Vital Statistics Act to allow mothers of illegitimate children to give them the father's name.

The act now will allow the child to have the father's name, provided the mother has been legally separated from her legal husband at least a year before she conceived and that the father consents to the use of his name.

In the past, illegitimate children had to be registered under the legal husband's name even if the child never used it.

Now the mother will fill out a form showing the child is illegitimate. But the final birth certificate, which will always be on record, will make no reference to legitimacy.
