While the United States entered the First World War, Miss MacDonald was one of the first to be recruited into the Army Nurse Corps and served at the Mars-sur-Aller base hospital. Her funeral services were held in Los Angeles.

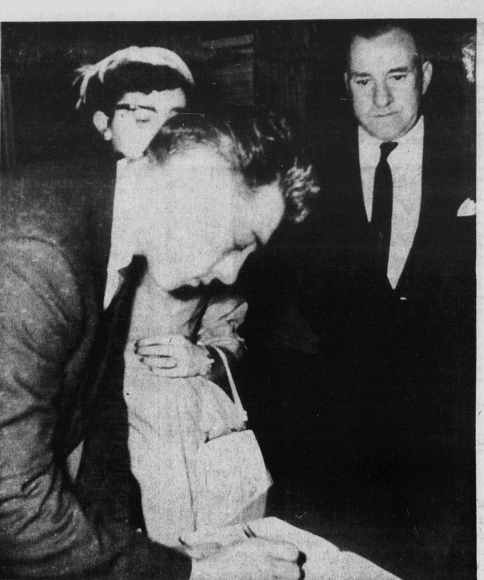

Pair Draw 2-Year Terms For Robbery

Two young men appearing yesterday afternoon before Judge C. St. Clair Trainor, in Queens County Court, were each sentenced to two years in Dorchester Penitentiary. Barry MacLeod, Dunstaffnage, and Barry Cass, Charlottetown, both pleaded guilty to charges of robbery with violence. The charges arose out of an incident which occurred on the night of Nov. 27, when Thomas MacMillan, N.E.W. Waterford, N.S., was beaten up and relieved of his wallet in a game-way between Tomb's Music Store and MacLeod Lunch Room. At their preliminary hearing before Magistrate A. J. Haslam in city police court, the pair had elected trial by Judge with a jury. Counsel for the defence was John J. Holmes, while the case for the crown was conducted by Alan Scales, crown prosecutor.
