PEI Union of Public Sector Employees (\$500)

This bursary is awarded annually to the PEI Union of Public Sector Employees to: (1) its members or (2) dependants of members or retired members. The University Public Relations Committee will base its decision on three factors which are as follows (in order of importance): (1) financial need, (2) academic ability, (3) UPSE involvement as a member of the member of whom the applicant is dependant. Please note that when applications are reviewed, it will be done in a blind test procedure whereby Committee members will not be aware of the applicants name. Applications must be in by December 1st, 1995 and may be picked up at Student Services.

Queen Elizabeth Silver Jubilee Endowment Fund For Study In A Second Official Language Award Program (\$500)

The purpose of this award is to encourage young Canadians who wish to improve their proficiency in the other official language and in a milieu in which that language predominates. All disciplines -- except translation -- are eligible. Students must continue studies in the discipline in which they are currently enrolled in their home university. The duration of the award is one academic year -- non renewable. Candidates must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada; (2) enrolled in the second or third year of their first undergraduate university program; and (3) well-motivated and adaptable in addition to having good academic standing. Preference will be given to candidates who wish to study at another educational institution. This award includes any Canadian university which is a member of, or affiliated with, the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada. Applications forms are available from UPEI Student Services only. You must return the completed application form, including necessary documentation to Student Services no later than January 15th, 1996.
