When the outcome of a contract is in doubt, depending upon how the defender's cards are divided, it is very comforting to declarer to discover a method of play that assures a bad contract regardless of a bad division of the adverse cards.
Here is an example of such a case. South was in four spades and West led a trump. Declarer realized immediately that if West had a substantial job party, particularly since West was marked by the bidding with practically all of the missing high cards.
