## The Search For the Green

Did you know that National Awards are available for you if you decide to go into graduate school after a first undergraduate degree? I'm going to reprint a typical national program and its conditions for award so that you can see that although organizations offering monies may ask a lot of you, they are also offering a lot to you. Prestige and money aren't bad pickings for an evening of your attention!

I have decided to use an example from the Canadian Federation for University Women because it is not always a well known one, and it also might encourage more women to attend graduate school beyond their first degree. This is indeed the fundamental purpose of any scholarship and bursary, and all organizations involved feel a very real motivation to provide awards for people exactly like yourself. They want you to attend graduate school, and they want to help you do it.

Drop by the Department of Student Services to see the incredible variety of awards involved in graduate school, and to a lesser degree. Those awards offered for professional schools like veterinary, medical, dentistry, and law school programs. I am hired to help sort out the process with you, but the information on file is set up in a self-serve system. Do see what is available.

Also, deadlines for undergraduate awards are coming up like the IODE Scholarships (for sophomores) by Nov, the Canadian

Water Resources Scholarship by Oct. 31, the Kidney Foundation of Canada - Summer Student Fellowship Program by Oct. 31, and the Pillsbury Undergraduate Scholarship Program by Nov 30.

Remember, the search for the green begins with you. Here are the conditions for a typical graduate award program:

### Canadian Federation of University Women

#### Graduate Awards for Women - Conditions

I. To proposed place and plan of study must be approved by the Fellowships Committee. The award will be based on academic achievement, potential and personal qualities.

II. Application forms may be obtained from the Chairman of the Fellowships Committee at CFUW Head Office (address below).

III. Completed applications must be returned to CFUW Head Office by December 1 and include:

- a) pages 1, 2 and 3 of the application form
- b) supporting documentation
- c) a money order or check for \$10.00 (Canadian) for filling fees.

IV. The following documents are to be sent to the Chairman. They will be regarded as confidential and will be retained by the Committee.

a) References from the three referees as to the scholarship, potential and personal qualities of the candidate. Preferably, these should be from more than one department and/or institution. These are to be sent directly to the Chairman from the referees.

b) Official transcript(s) of all the candidate's university records bearing the seal of the University, and sent directly to the Chairman by the Registrar.

V. Candidates may not hold additional awards in excess of \$1000 for the same academic year. Awards are not renewable.

VI. The acceptance of a graduate award implies the obligation on the part of the successful candidate to devote himself to study or research as outlined in her application. She shall submit any proposed change in her plan to the Chairman for approval by the Committee.

VII. The recipients of the McWilliams and Professional Fellowships shall send to the Chairman two reports of their work, the first on or before **January 15**, and the second at the end of their tenure. Each report is to be accompanied by a statement of the progress and quality of the student's work from the professor or other authority conversant with it.

VIII. The McWilliams and Professional Fellowships are payable in two equal installments. The first installment is payable August 1. The second installment is payable February 1 upon receipt by the Chair-

man of the Fellowships Committee of a satisfactory January report. Other awards are payable August 1.

IX. Any publications resulting from work done during the tenure of an award shall bear a note to the effect that the author has held an award of the Canadian Federation of University Women.

X. The Committee assumes no responsibility for making inquiries beyond the papers submitted. Complete documentation must be in the hands of the Chairman on or before **December 1**. Applications are considered incomplete unless all documents are received on or before this date.

XI. Applications and supporting papers are not returned, will not be used in subsequent years, and become the sole property of the CFUW Fellowships Committee.
