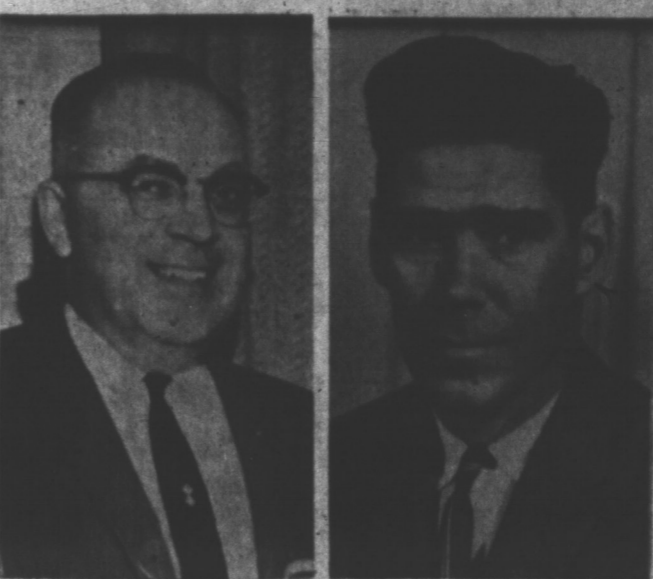

S'side Man Loses Appeal

SUMMERSIDE - John Cahill, Summerside, was arrested by Summerside police yesterday after he lost an appeal before a full bench at Charlottetown Thursday against a conviction and sentence of two years in Dorchester Penitentiary for break and entry at the Summerside Curling Club on Nov. 6, 1960.

Since being convicted of the break, Cahill has spent time in Riverside Hospital where he underwent observation and physioelectric treatment. He was also convicted, while out on bail, of joy-riding in a 1951 August 12 but won an appeal in Summerside before Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell.
