The international position has steadily deteriorated until today we find ourselves confronted with a grim picture of war. Speaking in a grim voice and using most of the time from the start of his speech, the Prime Minister condemned the German war for a violent anti-Polish campaign and for publishing "circumstantial accounts of alleged ill-treatment of Germans living in Poland."

House Cheers
The House cheered Mr. Chamberlain's observation that these "circumstantial" bear a strong resemblance to similar allegations which were made last year in respect of the Sudeten Germans living in Czechoslovakia.

The Prime Minister described the German war as a "very unpleasant character" but refused to "pass any final judgment" on the Russian action at present.

Time and again Mr. Chamberlain emphasized Britain's determination to stand by her promise to fight Poland if Poland goes to war to defend herself against Germany.

He went out of his way to explain that while the British-Polish mutual defence treaty has not been signed this does not "add to or subtract from the obligations of mutual assistance which have already been accepted."

Lord Halifax's Speech
Britain's determination to support Poland was underlined by Lord Halifax in his wide-spread radio address.

Lord Halifax said he earnestly trusts that the peace appeals of President Roosevelt and Pope Pius and yesterday's by Leopold, King of the Belgians, might "find a response in the hearts of men."

It is said that if Germany has any sense for complaint, she should make a settlement "a hundred times more difficult" by working up tension but should "let them alone" brought to cool examination before the public opinion of the world.

Mr. Chamberlain denied that Great Britain's recent military assistance amounts to an "act of aggression" but that Britain seeks "peace" in eastern Europe.

"We do not think of asking Germany to sacrifice her national interests," he said, "but we cannot agree that national interests can only be secured by the shedding of blood or the destruction of the independence of other states."

Colliers Tied Up By Strikes
GLACE BAY, N. S., Aug. 24—(CP)—Strikers tied up three big collieries in the Cape Breton peninsula tonight, throwing more than 2,000 men into idleness. An accident in a fourth pit left 1100 men idle.

For the fourth successive day coal was hoisted from Dominion Coal Company's Ca'donia Colliery. Workers who struck Monday when a fellow employee was denied a 75c wage increase continued the walkout.

A few remarks following the presentation.

May Meet Today
No further sessions of cabinet council have been fixed, but the Prime Minister said that his colleagues had been asked to stand ready for call on short notice and if developments make it advisable, a meeting will be called tomorrow.

Under the War Measures Act of 1914, which is still in force and which the prime minister said yesterday would serve in any emergency until parliament could be summoned, the government has almost unlimited power to take whatever steps considered necessary.

The prime minister said that today's session of council was largely devoted to consideration of "such measures as would require to be put into effect in the event of emergency both in relation to actual defence and in relation to trade and industry."

Numerous orders in council would be necessary to effect the regulations and control measures which would ordinarily follow an outbreak of hostilities, such as for censorship, the disposal of aliens shipping and transportation. It is assumed it was to these the Prime Minister referred.

An order in council would also be necessary for the summoning of Parliament. Presumably steps are being taken to have this ready for use at a moment's notice.

Sweden was pledged to refrain from aggression against Germany for 10 years.

Symbolizing the Soviet union's sudden shift in policy, Nazi swastikas fluttered along with Soviet red banners at the airport when Von Ribbentrop departed.

Launching a campaign to educate the public that Germany is now a friend, not a bitter ideological enemy, Soviet newspapers praised the agreement with Berlin as a bulwark for European peace.
