She Understood

An old Welsh woman said Christ was Welsh, and an Englishman replied, "No, He was a Jew." She declared that she knew He was Welsh, because He spoke so she could understand Him. The mission of the British and Foreign Bible Society is to give God's Word to all men in their own language so that they might understand Him even as one of their own race.

At least one book of the Bible is now printed in more than 1100 languages. But there are still over 1,500 dialects in which not one word of the Holy Scriptures have been printed. The need for more translations is a pressing one because there is a spirit of inquiry about the world today which many believe to signify an incoming tide of faith.

Campaigns by government and Christian missions are creating a reading world in Africa, Asia and the Pacific Islands and each year many millions of new readers emerge from the darkness of illiteracy.

Will it be the light of the Gospel which first illumines these minds through their new found gift or will corrupting influences exploit them? The answer may well be found in our response to the plea of the Bible Society for more funds.

2-Year Suspended Sentence Is Given On Bigamy Charge

Alfred Bernard, 43-year-old electrical technician, was given a two-year suspended sentence when he appeared before Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy in Supreme Court on Friday afternoon.

Bernard pleaded guilty to a charge of bigamy on Monday. His sentence was remanded to Wednesday and then to Friday.

R.R. Bell, Q.C., appearing for the accused, submitted five character references prior to the sentencing including Rev. A.F. MacLean, senior minister of Trinity United Church where Bernard married the former Mrs. McDuff last year, the president and secretary-manager of the local branch of the Canadian Legion, and a former employee. All spoke highly of the accused.

In his address to the accused, Mr. Justice Tweedy told the Court that "bigamy" is a very serious offence and is punishable by imprisonment of up to five years in the penitentiary.

SOCIETY'S BULWARK

"We all recognize that the home is the bulwark of society and that everything possible must be done to maintain it," he said.

He went on to say that the charge has been a rare one in this province and noted that only three such cases could be remembered or turned up, including the accused. The first saw a petit jury return of verdict of "not guilty" and the other drew a suspended sentence.

In meeting out his judgement Mr. Justice Tweedy said that "four cardinal principles should be taken into mind in sentencing the accused." These are (1) the protection of Society; (2) the punishment of the offender; (3) the deterrent effect upon others; and (4) the rehabilitation of the offender himself.

He went on to say that his judgement was based on all these factors taken as a group.

E. C. White Dies At Age Of 72

The death occurred in the Prince Edward Island Hospital Friday afternoon of Edwin Cleveland White in his 72nd year.

Born in Charlottetown, the late Mr. White was the son of the late Edwin White and Adeline (Fowler) White of Charlottetown. He was a retired Canadian National Railway Employee, serving as station agent at Vernon for 35 years prior to his retirement, due to ill health, in 1946. Since that time he has made his home with his only sister Mrs. J. Pope Clarke, 21 Greenfield Avenue.

A member of Zion Presbyterian Church, Mr. White was a Past Master of Mizpah Lodge, Number 17, A.F. and A.M. and also a life member of the I.O. O.F.
