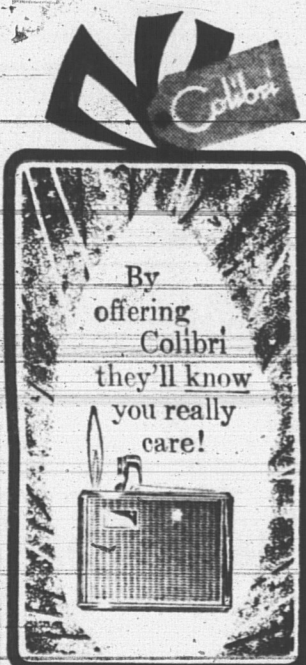
Apparel Plant Is Enticed To Ontario From Quebec Site

TORONTO (CP)—Ontario has lured an apparel manufacturer away from Quebec with the aid of a federal grant and the first capital loan ever made by the Ontario Development Agency. The manufacturer, Bantamac of Canada Ltd. of Montreal, makes men's and boy's sportswear and had 1965 sales of \$1,000,000.

Bantamac plans to locate in Glengarry County's depressed Charlottetown Township, about 16 miles north of Cornwall, and is expected to employ about 150 persons within two years. The need for larger premises and, apparently, rising labor costs in Montreal prompted the firm to seek an Ontario location. But an unnamed Quebec municipality offered Bantamac a \$60,000 grant to locate in a designated area, a report prepared by the federal-provincial Agriculture, Rehabilitation and Development Agency, directorate in Ontario said.

Strike Of Garbage Collectors Leaves Vancouver In Mess

VANCOUVER (CP)—A peacock stood on a picnic table in downtown Stanley Park, its tail trailing into the long, unkempt grass. Beside it was an empty whisky bottle, behind a rusted can. Another of the lovely birds stood in solitary splendor beside a bed of headless tulips, one of the normally neat and beautiful beds in the massive park now slowly being choked with weeds.

"Kind of a mess," a picketing member of the striking civic outside workers union was told as he trod by lawns plush with flowering daisies and sprinkled with paper. "Could get worse," he said grimly, walking on. An elderly man, out for his morning constitutional, sorrowfully pushed a piece of gum wrapper off the sidewalk with his umbrella.

"They'll settle soon," he said of the 1,500 outside employees—from garbage men to park maintenance workers—who have been on strike for higher wages for more than three weeks.

Downtown there is a scum of sodden cigarette packages, gum wrappers and other paper in street gutters.

BASKETS OVERFLOW
Litter baskets, fixed to the sidewalk on main streets are overflowing, sometimes with

boxes now falling apart after the pile-up refuse is even tasteful to the rag men who make a living picking it over for salvage. Householders are making trips to the city dump with their garbage. Failing that, they store it, burn it, bury it or find some way of disposing of it.

In the last category is the story of the woman seen driving around the park. When she came to an isolated part of the road she jammed on her brakes, jumped out and deposited her bag of garbage on the side, then sped off again.

Nfld. Pushed For Centennial Plans Speedup

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—Ottawa has been putting pressure on Newfoundland to get cracking on centennial year plans but the province is holding off until Come Home Year, 1966 festivities end officially Sept. 15. Public Works Minister J. R. Chalke said here.

Mr. Chalke, chairman of the centennial committee in New-

foundland, said the province is as far advanced in centennial planning as any other but it had been agreed by his committee that next year's national birthday celebrations would be played down during the 90-day day peak period of Come Home Year activities.

It is a "bit difficult to sell the centennial to Newfoundlanders, especially with all the m.p.h. the province is emphasizing on Come Home Year," he said.

All the committees engaged in this summer's arrangements will turn their attention to centennial celebrations after September, he said.
