CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You are South, neither side vulnerable. The bidding has been:
West North East South
1 ♠ Dble Pass ?
What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?
1. ♠ 7 ♥ KQ86532 ♦ K4 ♣ 772
2. ♠ 988 ♥ J852 ♦ 53 ♣ AK74
3. ♠ K982 ♥ A7 ♦ Q4 ♣ QJ863
4. ♠ 5 ♥ Q862 ♦ A784 ♣ KJ95
1. Four hearts. Opposite an in-fortunate double it is good enough to produce a game. With seven probable winning tricks it is not too much to expect that North will fill the gap with three more winners. It is as though North had opened the bidding as dealer, in which case you should feel bullish about the prospects of game. This is all the more true since the double practically guaranteed heart support.
It is better to respond with four hearts than three. By jumping directly to four the long heart is a jump response of three hearts would indicate interest in game but could be based on a much less impressive suit.
2. Two hearts. Partner's in-fortunate double shows an opening bid which may range as high as 20 or even more points. Our hand is good enough to support a game effort if North's double is a high-grade one. It is better to name hearts than clubs despite the disparity in strength. It is easier to make game in hearts and the major suit response is more apt to encourage a further bid from North than a two club response might. We have values of which partner is unaware and should do all we can to induce a continuation of the bidding.
3. Two notrump. Game is decidedly probable. We have virtually an opening bid facing an opening bid. Most likely spot for game is in notrump. This seems much easier to make than an eleven-trick contract for game in clubs. Mention of the club suit is therefore suppressed in favor of the notrump potentialities.
4. Two spades. This hand figures to make game in one of three suits, but it is difficult to know which one partner can best support. Instead of trying to guess the suit by jumping to the three level in one of our suits, and thus at the same time showing a good hand by the skip bid, we push the choice back to North by cuebidding West's suit.
Partner cannot very well misunderstand the call since if spades were actually our long suit, we would leave the double of one spade in rather than attempt to play at a pade contract. Whichever suit North now bids we contract for game in that suit forthwith.

N.B. Salmon Catch Shows Big Upswing This Season

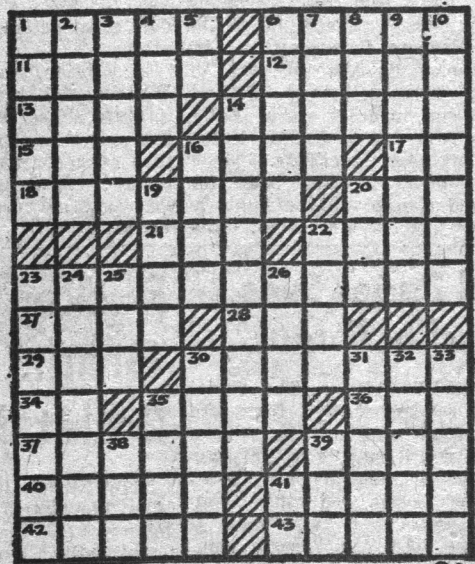
FREDERICTON (CP) — Reports from New Brunswick fishing areas indicate more Atlantic salmon in some rivers than at any time in the last 10 years.
A fisheries official said Wednesday that 1,155 salmon went up a fishway at Beechwood on the St. John River up to July 21. He said last year only 21 fish passed through the fishway, which was completed in July.
Good catches are also reported on the Restigouche River and its tributaries and from both branches of the Miramichi.
A new pool created on the St. John below the Beechwood power development, about 100 miles upstream from here, has proved a popular spot. Daily catches of 50 to 75 fish are fairly common there.
Conditions are not quite so favorable below Beechwood. Salmon can be seen in large numbers but some combination of river height and temperature seems to hamper anglers.
Fisheries officials say that in most streams catches this year have been averaging half a pound per fish higher than in previous years.
Reports of good fishing came just after fish and game experts predicted that poison sprays used in forest insect control had severely damaged salmon stocks in this province.
Enthusiastic reports have come from tourist resort proprietors, guides, government officials, local anglers and residents along New Brunswick's best salmon streams.

Reporter Posed As Doctor In Vancouver Hospital 23 Days

VANCOUVER (CP) — A newspaper reporter who posed as a doctor in St. Paul's hospital here for 23 days attended five births in the delivery room, but performed only two deliveries, under supervision, hospital authorities reported Wednesday.
Jack Brett, now a reporter on the Prince George Citizen, has confirmed he was an intern in the hospital last April. He went under the name of Dr. Jack Harris.
Dr. Paul P. Jackson, chairman of the intern committee at St. Paul's, said Brett had doctors standing at his elbow giving instructions during the two deliveries. At the other deliveries he was an observer only.
Brett was suspended when his claims to medical qualification failed to check out.
The 26-year-old reporter said in an interview in Prince George he worked at St. Paul's to gather material for a magazine article "to spotlight for public information just how difficult it is for a person to attain so responsible a position without any more than an intensive interest in the field."
Hospital authorities are investigating and will issue a report, but, Dr. Jackson says, no prosecution is planned.
A new system of checking credentials will be established at the hospital.
"It will be ironclad in future," said Dr. Jackson.
He explained that during the

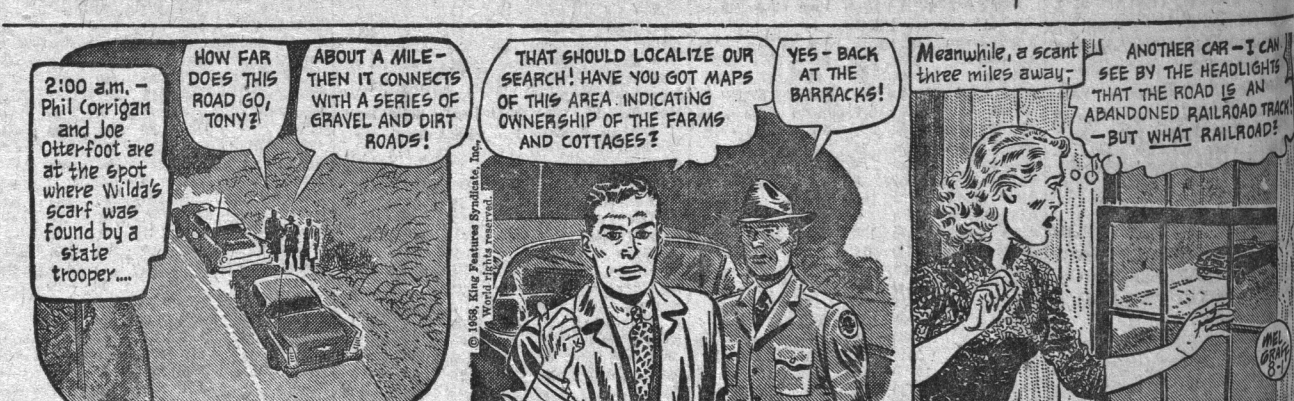
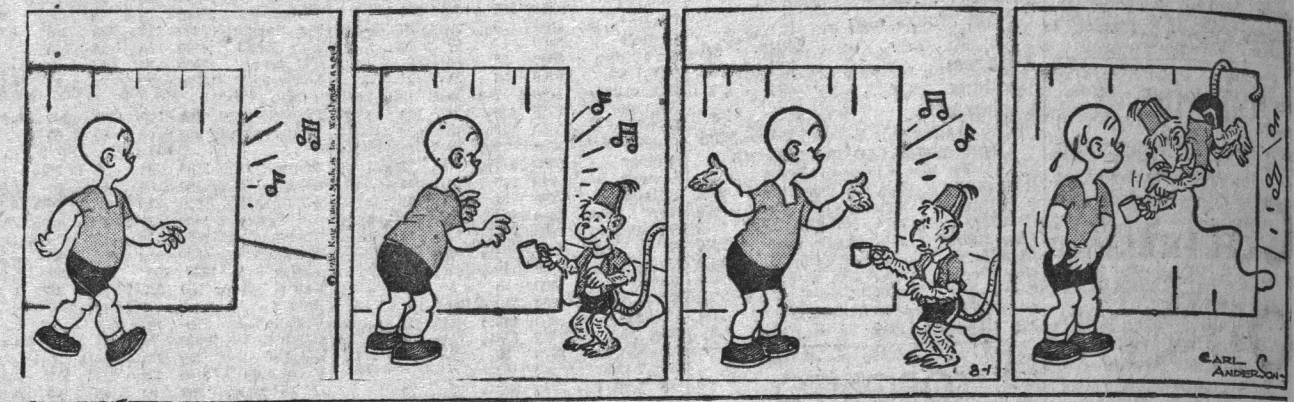
