**Nine Witnesses Called In Preliminary Hearing**

SUMMERSIDE—The preliminary hearing of a charge of break, entry and theft at the general store of Harold Phillips, Freeland, against Carl Joseph Franklin Arsenault and Touissant Bernard, both of Summerside, was held in County Court yesterday before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald. Crown Prosecutor George R. McMahon, assisted by Sgt. W.J.R. MacDonald, called nine witnesses.

Harold Phillips, owner of the store, said that he had discovered the break at about 7:55 on the morning of Monday, Sept. 20. He stated that he had found a safe broken open and cash missing in the amount of \$1,000 to \$1,200, and that the window to the meat room had been broken in.

Wilbur Banks, Freeland, said that he and his wife had been driven home by his sister, Mrs. Gerald Wagner, by way of the Murray Road on Sunday night, Sept. 19, and that he had seen parked by the side of the road a 1956 car, two-tone green or blue, with its hood up.

Cpl. H. Victor Cameron, RCMP Summerside, stated that he had placed Carl Arsenault under arrest on Sept. 23, that Sgt. MacDonald had given accused a police warning in the police car and that accused had answered a series of questions at the RCMP headquarters and the corporal had written the questions and answers down, but the accused had refused to sign the paper.

The magistrate ruled that the questions and answers were inadmissible as evidence. Cpl. Cameron said that he had been with ex-constable Knowles of the RCMP when Knowles, with the aid of a police dog, had found three metal bars in the woods in the area of the Freeland store.

SEARCHED HOUSE  
Sgt. Harry MacKay, Summerside Town Police, said he had searched the house at 538 Sheen Street, where Carl Arsenault was living, with Const. Cox of the RCMP on Sept. 23 and found in a dress hanging on a bedroom wall a roll of money wrapped in elastic tape bandage and that it amounted to \$364. He stated that Carl Arsenault said the money was his.

Const. D.J. Saturley, of the RCMP crime detection laboratories at Sackville, N.B., said he had received a bar from Opl. Cameron, and that in his opinion the paint particles he found on the bar were of the same type of paint as that on the safe in the Freeland store.

Other Crown witnesses were Wanda DesRoches, sister-in-law of Carl Arsenault; William MacNally, who operated a blacksmith and welding shop in Summerside; Mrs. Gerald Wagner, Freeland; Edgar Henderson, Freeland.

CHARGE DISMISSED  
The charge of incest against Peter Frank Labobe, Lennox Island, was dismissed for lack of evidence.

Edmund Joseph Perry, Tignish Shore; George Laurence Baird, Morell; Urban Joseph Perry, Miscouche; Joseph Arthur Arsenault, Tignish; and Joseph John Pierre Riel Gaston were each fined \$75 plus costs or 15 days for driving while impaired.

John Henry Ellis, Northam, represented by Bernard McCabe, pleaded not guilty to an impaired charge and had his case adjourned for a date to be set later.

Bennett MacDonald, Traveler's Rest, was fined \$200 plus costs or three months in jail for assaulting a police officer with intent to resist arrest, and further fined \$75 plus costs or 15 days for impaired driving.

George Edward Curtis, Albany, was fined \$25 plus costs or 15 days for driving without due care and attention, and fined \$20 and costs or 30 days for illegal possession of liquor. He pleaded not guilty to a charge of causing bodily harm and this case was adjourned to Dec. 2 for a date of trial to be set.
