

Results Of Grade Eleven Examinations Announced

260 students were successful in the Grade Eleven Examination results released yesterday by the Department of Education. Of these 63 or 24.23 per cent passed with first class standing of 75 per cent or over; 80 or 30.77 per cent passed with second class standing of 60 to 74 per cent, and 117 or 45 per cent passed with third class standing of 50 to 59 per cent.

INFORMATION FOR EMPLOYERS

REGISTRATION: Immediately upon becoming an employer under the Act it is required that such employer register with the Board and file an estimate of his pay roll for the current year. This is necessary whether the workmen are paid a stated wage, or by piece work, or on any basis by which they are remunerated for their labor under a contract of service.

INFORMATION FOR WORKMEN

Workmen engaged in Industries within the Scope of this Act are entitled to protection with respect to personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of their employment. It is therefore, important that workmen know whether or not their Employer is registered with this Board thus insuring prompt handling of their claims should they be injured while in the course of their employment.
