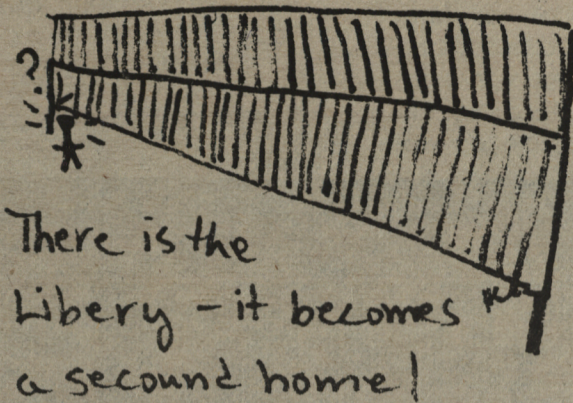


MAIN EVENTS

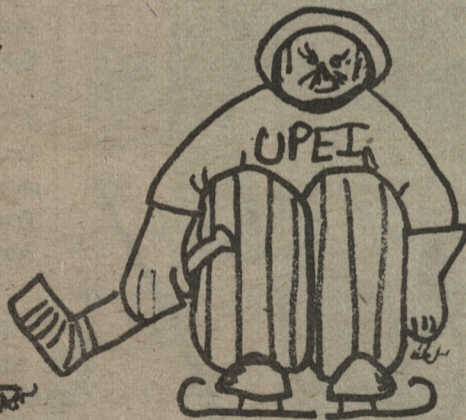


Fanci Jean Waugh
