

CURRENT NOTES.

The influenza among Montreal horses is increasing.

A Victoria, B. C., despatch says the House meets on the 16th inst. It is believed there will be no Opposition to the return of the Ministry.

The granddaughter of Charles Dickens is about to make her debut on the stage. She is quite a young woman, and is set of the Lily or rose order. But since childhood she has had a passion for the stage, and is supposed to have talent for it of a high order. This, probably, she inherits from Dickens, whose histrionic ability was of a high order. Charles Dickens would, probably, have won distinction as an actor, if he had not devoted himself to novel writing.

The preventibility of death by sanitary precautions is strongly illustrated by the immunity that physicians enjoy from contagious diseases. Last year twenty-two eminent English medical men died whose ages varied from seventy-eight to ninety-two. These gentlemen during their long lives were constantly brought into contact with the most infectious diseases, yet escaped, showing that by taking proper precautions the dangers from plagues and pestilence can be reduced to a minimum.

The co-operative movement has reached the English nobility. A club has been formed for getting great gentlemen cheap wine and abolishing the wine merchant. At its head is Lord Ashley, and among its patrons are Prince Leiningen, cousin of the Queen, Lord Ellesmere, Lord Wolseley, and other great dignitaries. These gentlemen, impatient of the charges of their wine merchants, have formed themselves into a co-operative tasting and buying society, and as the Vine Club, will meet socially for the purpose of supplying their cellars with wine.

Apprehensions of the approach of serious Indian troubles in the North-West and beyond are often expressed, and little scares are frequently got up on the subject. The latest fear given vent to relates to the appearance of things near Fort Walsh. Thus far, however, all scares of this sort have proved unfounded. There have been no serious troubles among our North West or British Columbia Indians since the Union. The fact is positively delightful. And the prospect of a perfectly peaceful settlement of the whole Indian question appears excellent. Such a settlement is a consummation to be ardently desired. We hope the Dominion Government will have the felicity of witnessing it.

A striking and painful proof of the intensity of the present age and the break-neck pace at which society is rushing along is furnished by the number of suicides committed by mere children. A few days ago Emma Swayne, of Painesville, Ohio, a girl fifteen years of age, quarrelled with her boy lover and committed suicide. This burlesque of elder passion disturbing a school-girl is terrible. The Georges and Anelias of our grandmothers' time would not have acted so, nor two generations before that would any of Richardson's sentimental creations have so conducted themselves. We cannot imagine Harriet Byron or Miss Orme in short clothes committing suicide for beardless Sir Hargraves, Grevelles, or Grandisons. In those days if Miss Harriet had hinted at passion and despair she would have smarted under a sound discipline, and been sent to bed to cure her of romance. In those days boys read "Robinson's Crusoe" and "Pilgrim's Progress" and girls worked samplers, and there was no gloating over sensational newspapers and erotic novels, and there was no talk of passion in pinafores, infant suicides, and child murderers.

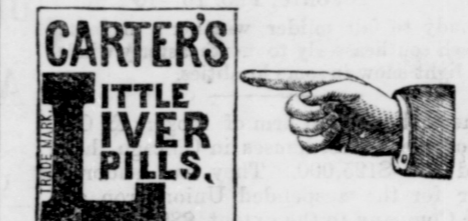
