THE MARKETS.

Cheese and Butter a Little Lower.

The Montreal Gazette of Tuesday reports that the softer feeling which had its inception last week continues. There from 7,000 to 8,000 cheese were sold on Monday at 9 1/2 to 9 7/8c, which shows a decline of about 1/2c per pound on the price which ruled the previous Monday.

Butter, also, is somewhat easier, in tone than it was last week, business in creamery being noted at 21c to 21 1/2c, as to grade, higher figures have been realised for the same goods last week, while western dairy realized 15c to 16 1/2c.

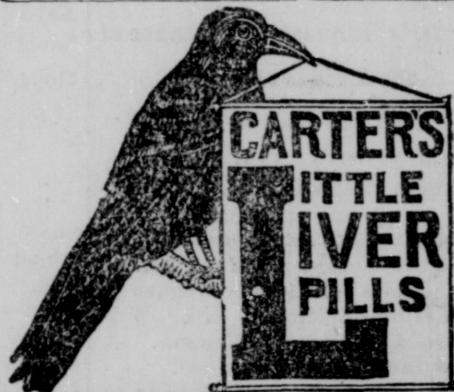
A Good Price for Eggs.

Montreal advices state that the tone of the market is stronger at the recent advance in prices. The demand is rather slow owing to the very warm weather, and trade is of a jobbing character.

Live Hogs Active.

In Montreal heavy hogs are quotable at \$5 to \$5.05 per hundred lbs; mixed, \$5.10 to \$5.12; Yorkers, \$5.10 to 5.15; pigs, \$4.75 to \$4.85; grassers, \$4.75 to \$4.95; roughs, \$3.90 to \$4.15; stage, \$3.25 to \$3.50.
