Churches are persecuted, others are unjust-solve these problems and "all will be for the best in the best of all possible worlds". I would suggest that this is an either/or situation. Either churches

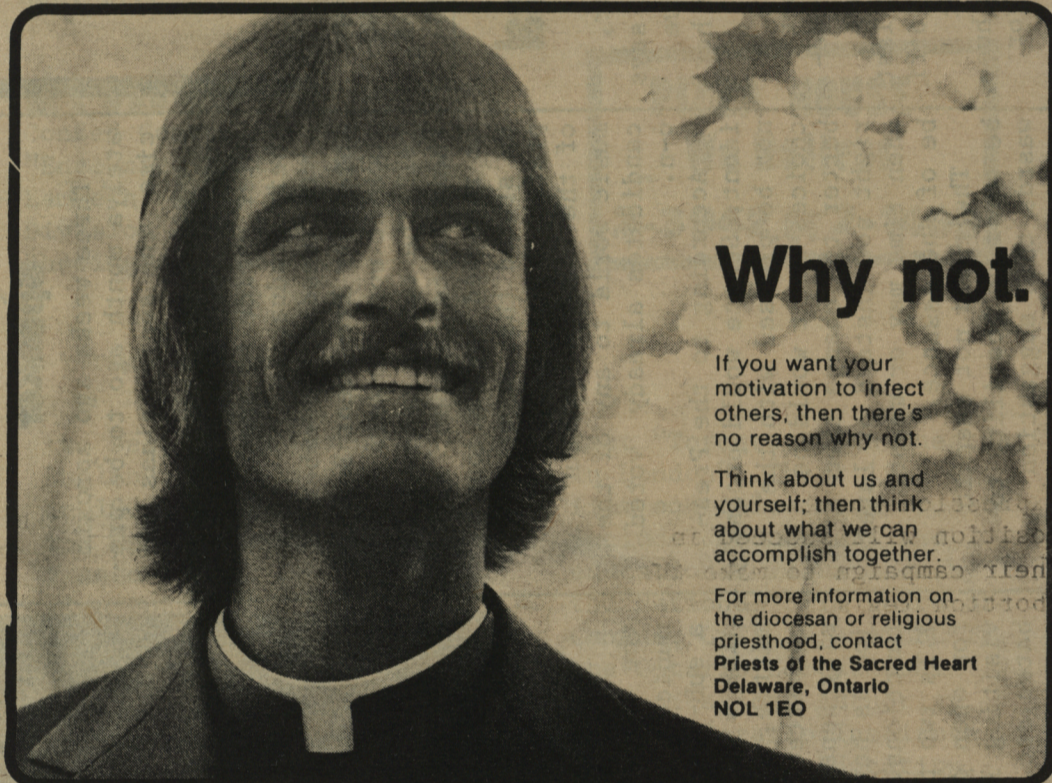

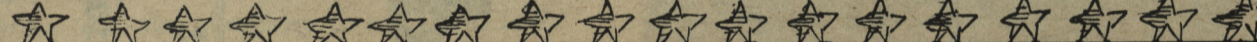
