I was disappointed when I read last week's SUN and you had not printed the list of students who made the Deans List. first semester. The March 9th issue of Topics carried

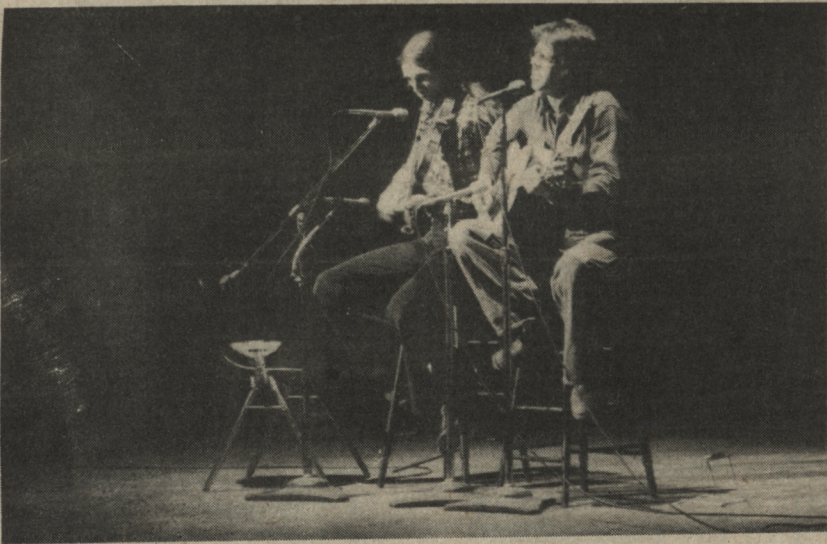
this list. I had hoped your paper would have done the same.

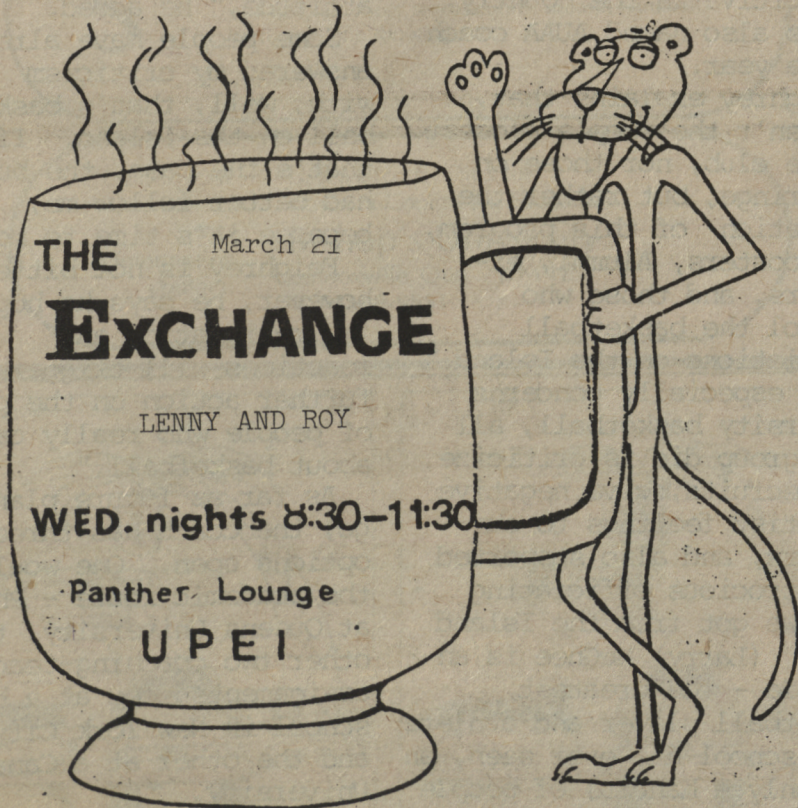
