INTERVIEW WITH ADMIRAL DEWEY

Will Stay Two Weeks at Hong Kong.

HAS GREAT FAITH IN FUTURE OF THE PHILIPPINES.

The Rebellion Almost Over—Aguinaldo Must Be Captured.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

NEW YORK, May 25.—A despatch from Hong Kong quotes Dewey as follows:

During the year that has elapsed since I came to Manila I have not had one sick day until now.

A year is long enough in this climate for an old man, and I am glad to be permitted a rest. On this account I expect to remain at Hong Kong two weeks. That ought to recuperate me.

I have the greatest enthusiasm in the future of the Philippines. I hope to see American possessions the key to Oriental commerce and civilization.

The brains of our great country will develop the untold agricultural and mineral riches of the Islands. We must never sell them; such an action would bring on another great war.

I am sure in future years the idea that anybody should have seriously suggested it, will be one of the curiosities of history. The insurrection is broken. There will be no more hard battles and the new era of islands that was temporarily delayed by the rising will soon begin.

Aguinaldo and his generals must be captured, and then every semblance of an insurrection will cease.

A Big Mortgage.

NEW YORK, May 24.—The largest mortgage recorded in the history of Suffolk county was filed today in the office of the county clerk at Riverhead, L. I. It is for \$45,000,000, given by the Long Island railroad in favor of the U. S. Mortgage and Trust Company as trustees. Attached to the mortgage are 450 \$50 revenue stamps, making a total of \$22,500. The mortgage covers all the property of the railroad. The railroad intends to make extensive improvements and cancel outstanding bonds. The mortgage is given to protect the new bonds issued for these improvements.

Fortifying Halifax.

HALIFAX, May 23.—The Imperial authorities have decided to construct another fortress here. It will be located at a point near Herring Cove head, south of York redoubt, facing the sea. The new fort will contain quick firing batteries, with the latest type of armament. It has been decided to remodel a large portion of the interior of York redoubt for new batteries to be placed there. The old eighteen and twelve ton guns will be shipped to Quebec for defence purposes.

Prof. Schurman's Proposal.

MANILA, May 24.—Prof. Schurman, head of the United States Philippines Commission, has submitted the following written proposition to the Filipinoes:—"While the final decision as to the form of government is in the hands of Congress, the President, under his military powers, pending the action of Congress, stands ready to offer the following form of Government:—

"A Governor-General to be appointed by a Cabinet to be appointed by the Governor General, all the judges to be appointed by the President, the heads of departments and judges to be either American or Filipinoes, or both, and also a general advisor, council, its members to be chosen by the people by a form of suffrage to be hereafter carefully determined upon.

"The commission earnestly desires that bloodshed cease, and that the people of the Philippines, at an early date, enjoy the largest measure of self-government compatible with peace and order."

SIR,—I see the government has sent a Mr. Kinsman here, whom they claim is an expert grafter, sprayer and pruner. One day last week farmers and the public in general were invited to the orchard of Mr. Mason, where this man was to give a few pointers and any information pertaining to horticulture. As I am somewhat interested in this branch of our industry, I attended this exhibition of the so-called government expert and naturally expected to hear or see something of some import. In so far as the "exhibition" part of it was concerned I must admit it was truly an exhibition of something the man knew little about; and I must here say that the government is treating our farmers and fruit growers shamefully when they try to palm off such "experts" as this Mr. Kinsman (who by the way receives a nice little salary for this instruction and advice) upon them. He certainly displayed great ignorance when, asked to make a whip graft, he replied by innocently asking "what is a whip graft?" It was indeed painful to see him use a Bordeaux mixture on plum trees, a mixture any school boy knows to be ruinous to the tree. I do not see why any honest government should go to the trouble and the expense of paying a fat salary to this man who by the way was supposed to come from the Ontario Experimental Farm, but who really comes from Nova Scotia, when we have such experienced and competent men as Mr. D. A. Sharp and his assistant Mr. McLaughlin, both of whom are better and more competent than this highly-salaried expert. Let us hear what Mr. Farquharson, who claims great credit for bringing Mr. Kinsman here, has to say on this matter.
