Handles Skins Like Fabrics

PARIS (Reuters) — Pierre Balmain presented his latest interpretation in using furs for fashions Tuesday and they appeared in trench coats, suits and dresses. Skins are handled like fabrics, his fall and winter collection revealed.

His latest classic ermine garment is an evening dress. A wide, full-length, belted skirt made entirely of ermine was set off by a simple bodice with round neckline and long sleeves of black velvet. In the use of furs in suits and dresses, black broadtail is the favored fur to replace fabric. Trims include enormous cuffs of fur that button into wide coat sleeves.

Other models suggest a stole effect, but the wide sleeve, no matter how it is handled, remains the theme of the collection.

Sleeves narrow down for formal wear in the oriental-inspired dinner costumes called the "Daiji Lama" line.

SLEEVES STRAIGHT — Here they are straight, trouser-leg versions, covered with heavy embroideries matching the all-over floral embroideries on the jerkin blouse.

Coats are predominantly full, with easy folds falling unhemmed at the back from the shoulder line, which is dropped to accentuate the sleeves. There is only an occasional casually-belted coat. Suits again reiterate big sleeve treatments, with two trends evinced in jackets. The first is a longer, tapered jacket and the second takes on a leather belt with gathered bottom. Blouses, back, snug-waisted boleros accompany many of the slender fitted day dresses. Necklines are unanimously high and restrained.

Balmain's color combinations are unusual. He lines the long stole of a cloth of gold ensemble with melon-colored chiffon. A deep purple velvet cloak and matching ball gown is enhanced by the satin cerise lining. **MILLINERY REVERSES** — Millinery established a complete about-face. All volume has disappeared, replaced by small, head-hugging shapes, like helmets and casques. There are diminutive draped turbans and berets, without a single brim in the entire collection. Symmetry is the keyword, and many hats angle across the hairline, establishing profile effects on one side.

Balmain colors are bright and vary through all the intense shades with blues and purples ahead. There are some translucent bronze tones for evening, and a great deal of white and black.

IN MEMORIAM

DANIEL MACKENZIE
On Sunday morning, July 21st, in Arlington, Mass., Daniel MacKenzie, a native of Canoe Cove, P.E.I., aged 83 years, calmly passed away, after a long and weary illness, which he bore with great patience and fortitude to the end. Three years previous to his passing, his wife by a second marriage, namely, Miss Stella Murphy, native of Cumberland, P.E.I., passed away suddenly while nursing him tenderly at what proved, three years later, to be his dying bed.

The deceased was the eldest son of the late Neil MacKenzie, and his late wife, Jessie, formerly

Jessie MacNevin, both parents being native-born residents of Canoe Cove.

Overly sixty years ago, Dan MacKenzie, as he was popularly called left his peaceful homeland to seek a livelihood among the busy multitudes of Boston, Mass. A few years after his arrival there, he was united in marriage to Miss Ada Hall, of Enfield, N.S., who predeceased him at an early age, after giving birth to six children, five of whom survive their father, namely: one son, Harold, of Truro, N.S., and four daughters, namely: Mrs. Lottie Holbrook, of Waltham, Mass., Mrs. Marion Whalen, of Walpole, Mass., Mrs. Helen O'Connell, of Jamaica Plains; and Mrs. Gertrude Smith, of Boston, Mass. Another son, Ev-

erett, predeceased his father nine years ago in Bangor, Maine. Both sons were in the forces in the First World War, and injuries received there, in all probability, hastened Everett's death at an age usually considered the prime of life.

Besides one son and four daughters already mentioned nine grandchildren also survive the deceased, also two sisters, namely: Mrs. Jessie Inman, of Canoe Cove, P.E.I., and Mrs. Florrie Dwyer, of Boston, Mass., and four brothers namely: Roderick and John Edward, both residing in California, Neil in Saskatchewan, and Malcolm, at present in Argyle Shore, P.E.I. One sister, Mrs. John MacFadyen, of Canoe Cove, predeceased him seven years ago.

Several years before his death, the late Dan MacKenzie had expressed to his family a wish to be buried in Canoe Cove Churchyard, beside his parents and among the friends of his youth. This wish was faithfully fulfilled by his son, Harold, and two daughters, Lottie and Marion, who accompanied his remains to his native island, and attended his funeral and burial services at Canoe Cove Church and Cemetery, which took place on Thursday afternoon, July 24th.

The funeral service, which was largely attended by friends and relatives of the deceased, was conducted by Rev. George Killen, pastor in charge of Canoe Cove Presbyterian Church, who preached an appropriate and solemnly impressive sermon, stressing with great emphasis the solemnity of life and death, from the following texts: Hebrews 9: 27; Philippians 1: 21; and Matthew 24: 44. The music for the service was conducted by the Church choir. Miss Louisa MacKenzie officiating fittingly at the organ. Immediately before the Benediction, the choir and congregation united in singing the old, familiar Scottish psalm phrase "O God of Bethel", with its well-known lines—beautiful and appropriate for the occasion, and all similar ones.

The burial service was conducted by the MacLean Funeral Undertakers, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., the pall bearers being as follows: James and Norman MacKenzie, Dan and James MacNevin, Lauchie MacKinnon, and Albert MacDougall. After a brief prayer at the grave by the presiding pastor, the body of the late Dan MacKenzie was laid by friendly hands to its last earthly rest.

Text Of Brief On Behalf Of Potato Industry Of P. E. I.

The text of a brief presented to the Tariff Board of Canada re Tariff Board Reference 124 submitted on behalf of the potato industry of Prince Edward Island is as follows.

The Tariff Board's investigation of the potato industry two years ago (T.B. Reference No. 117), and its report thereon provides a detailed picture of this industry to that time. In our present submission, which has to do only with Tariff Items 83a and 83 b, we have endeavoured to bring the picture up to date.
