Hydro Development Pushed Ahead To Attract Industry, Cut Pollution

EDMONTON (CP) — Construction of the Brazeau River hydro development is being pushed ahead 10 years to attract industry along the North Saskatchewan River and to reduce downstream pollution. The project initially will cost about \$45,000,000. Calgary Power Limited and Alberta government officials have announced that work on the project will begin immediately. The site of the dam and powerhouse will be on the Brazeau River, about 100 miles southwest of here.

The Brazeau flows into the North Saskatchewan. It represents about 25 per cent of the flow of the North Saskatchewan at Edmonton, and the Brazeau development has been found to be one of the best ways of coping with the need for a larger water supply for industry and the pollution problem associated with low water levels during winter.

A. W. Howard, general manager of Calgary Power, said the company — chief producer of power in the province — had not intended "to develop the Brazeau site until the demand for power had grown sufficiently to justify its initial high cost," about 1970.

PLANS CHANGED
The company is going ahead with the project now because the provincial government considers that a reservoir to catch spring and summer runoff will assist industry and relieve the pollution problem on the North Saskatchewan.

D. A. Hansen, the company's general sales manager, said more industries and communities will be able to establish themselves along the banks of the North Saskatchewan, "attracted by an adequate water supply near a rapidly developing market area."

Work on the project will take about four years. The plant's first unit will provide some peak capacity in late autumn of 1963. There would be only a limited amount of water available to increase the flow of the North Saskatchewan during the winter of 1963-64 because the reservoir would not be filled completely.

A full reservoir, however, would be available the following winter.

The power from the plant would be for peak loads which occur in the winter months, the company said. The water stored in the reservoir would be used for the generation of power and simultaneously "to augment approximately five times the natural winter flow of the North Saskatchewan through Edmonton and downstream of the city."

TO BUILD ROAD
Agriculture Minister L. C. Halmrast said the government has agreed to build an access road to the damsite. It will run about 20 miles west of Lodgepole, in the Pemina oil field southwest of here.

Company engineers have carried out preliminary investigations of the site for the last two years. These investigations included stream flow studies, topographical surveys, drilling and soil testing.

Except for tracked vehicles, access to the site during the summer is impossible because of the muskeg. Helicopters have been used extensively. In winter standard wheeled vehicles are used.

TWO-MILES-DAM
Initial development and construction will include a 10,000,000-cubic-yard earth fill dam two miles long. A reservoir in the Brazeau Valley will contain 900,000 acre-feet of usable water storage with an area of 37 square miles.

A 12-mile canal below the dam will convey water to the powerhouse about six miles west of the junction with the North Saskatchewan. The powerhouse will contain initially a 200,000-horsepower generating unit.

The company, whose Alberta generators now produce 485,000 horsepower, will be able to expand its capacity at the Brazeau site by at least four times, at a cost of 10,000,000 for each additional 200,000-horsepower unit, including transmission lines.

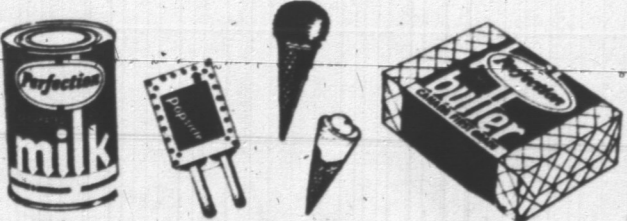
