Red Cross Blood Clinics Open Third Series Aug. 24

Arrangements are now complete for the third visit for 1959 of the Red Cross mobile blood donor team from Halifax. This third series is now just ten days away as the team will arrive in Charlottetown on Sunday, August 23rd to hold clinics during the first four days of that week at New Glasgow, North Rustico, Canoe Cove, Eldon, Cardigan, Souris, Murray River and Montague.

Legion branches at North Rustico, Eldon, Cardigan, Souris and Montague and each has an energetic committee in charge. "Heading the arrangements of the New Glasgow clinic are the Junior Farmers of the area, while the Women's Institutes will again co-operate in preparing for and assisting with all the clinics. They are entirely responsible for the Canoe Cove clinic, and will play an important role in the Murray River appeal.

The objective set for the four days of clinics is 1,152 with each centre having a quota equal to the best results achieved at past clinics. It is particularly important that the required numbers be attained in view of the fact that the April clinics in Charlottetown, as well as the June effort in Prince County, both fell short of the objective with just 2,657 of the desired 3,266 registering, and making a shortage of over 600.

Pasture Competition Second County Results Due Soon

The Pasture Competition, sponsored by the Dairyman's Association and the P.E.I. Dept. of Agriculture, is to focus attention on pasture and to promote a better understanding and appreciation of the value of better pastures and pasture management—with an eye to management which will produce superior pastures and thus increase the income per acre from products from grass.

In the pasture competition, 38 entries were received—Queens, 25; Kings, 25; and Prince 29. The first official judging was carried out during June 22-27 by six judges—two in each county. One of these judges was from the Dept. of Agriculture, the other had practical experience in Pasture Management.

GRASS PROVINCE
Prince Edward Island is, basically, a grass Province i.e. one which can produce grass in abundance if properly managed. At present the revenue from pasture, in most instances, is far from what is possible and should be. A uniform supply of high quality forages throughout the spring, summer and fall months is the object of pasture management.

The judges in Prince were: Dave Rogers and Larry Doucette; Queens, Dave Peacock and Gordon MacMillan; Kings, John Chandler and Brichfield Yeo. The second county judging will be carried out during the first week of August and results will be reported early next week. The top three winners of each county competition will compete for Provincial prizes. Prize money to the extent of \$350, will be awarded in the fall, this being furnished by the Dairyman's Association, The Beef Breed Associations and the P.E.I. Department of Agriculture.

It is hoped that all those who entered have gained some useful ideas for grassland improvement and Pasture Management. Remember—Management is the key to the solution of superior pastures.
