speaking of the revival of the trade
of Great Britain, of which it says there

far less than our neighbors from the wave
of depression. Our trade is on a sound and
conservative basis, and hence, it will only
need a moderate stimulus to place Cana-
dian trade once more upon a prosperous foot-
ing. This stimulus is apparently not far
distant."


